




Population of Maine (1960-2040)




Population of Androscoggin County, 1960-2020




Population of Franklin County, 1960-2020




Population of Oxford County, 1960-2020



Decennial Population, 10 Largest Municipalities




Components of Population Change, Maine

A Visual representation of projected population shifts over time.



Population projections estimate the future population size based on current trends. When used in conjunction with local data and knowledge, they provide valuable insight.

Please note: While these projections are available in 5-year intervals out to 2040, we encourage limiting the use of projections beyond 2030 if possible.



Projected Population Change, 2025-2030




Androscoggin County, 2020, Observed population








Franklin County, 2020, Observed population













Median Age 2020 - 2022




Share of 2020 Population by Race/Ethnicity Excluding Non-Hispanic White Alone








Employment by Industry, Androscoggin County, 2019-2022




Moving Four Quarter Average Wage Per Job






Total Nonfarm Employment Maine (seasonally adjusted)




Annual Average Unemployment Rate




Labor Force Participation - State Level



Labor Force Participation Rates by Age Group (2017-2021)




Median Home Prices, 2012-2022
