

MAINE: A DEMOGRAPHIC SNAPSHOT

- 2019 Population Estimate: 1,344,212
 - 42nd largest in US
- 2010 2019 Population Change: +1.2%
 - 40th among U.S. states (ahead of WV, IL, VT, CT, MS, NY, RI, PA, NJ, MI)
- 2018 Median age: 44.9 years
 - Oldest in US
- 6.9% not identifying as white, non-Hispanic
 - Lowest percentage in US



IMPROVING POPULATION GROWTH

- In 2019, Maine's rate of total population increase (0.4%) ranked 25th
- The annual rate of net migration (5.6 people per 1,000 population) ranked 16th in the nation

What's happening?

- Other states in the U.S. are starting to see their populations age and migration (both domestically and internationally) has slowed
- Maine has been at the leading edge and now other states are catching up




All counties had positive net migration with the exception of Aroostook, which was neutral (migration out = migration in)




THE BABY BOOM WAVE




Maine Population Trends by Age 1950-2026








Components of Population Change, Maine







MIGRATION EFFECTS FROM COVID-19?


- Maine's lower population density may prove increasingly attractive to people in the coming months and years

- We'll be watching closely for indications of increased migration














UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN MAINE AND THE U.S. WERE AT OR NEAR RECORD LOWS AT THE END OF 2019




UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN ALL COUNTIES WERE LOWER AT THE END OF 2019 THAN AT THE END OF 2018


UNEMPLOYMENT RATES JUMPED ACROSS ALL COUNTIES IN APRIL




THE CENSUS BUREAU IS CONDUCTING WEEKLY PULSE SURVEYS OF HOUSEHOLDS AND SMALL BUSINESSES

- 50% of households with children under age 18 present reported a loss of employment income compared to 39% of households without children
- 40% of 25-39 year-olds reported a status of not employed in the past week compared to 28% of 40-54 year-olds
- 88% of those not working at the time of the survey reported receiving no pay during time not working
 - does not include unemployment benefits


DECLINES IN SMALL BUSINESS EMPLOYEE HOURS SEEM TO HAVE MOSTLY LEVELED OFF





LABOR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATES DROPPED IN APRIL



Total Nonfarm Employment (in thousands) History and CEFC forecast










STATE GDP





 - Average annual wages (\$48,470)



UMAINE SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS RAPID BUSINESS CLIMATE SURVEY (WEEK OF JUNE 2-7)


- 64% of businesses responded that they were operating with modifications to meet social distancing requirements
- 75% of businesses responded that they had seen a large negative effect from the COVID-19 pandemic
- Key challenges identified included:
 - Travel restrictions
 - Revenue/cash flow/finances
 - Social distancing/operating restrictions
 - Consumer confidence



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


Maine relies heavily on heating oil and gasoline – as a result, crude oil prices have a big impact on Maine's economy (when we're driving, that is)






Weekly New England Retail Gasoline Prices (Dollars per Gallon)







IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO BE COUNTED IN THE 2020 CENSUS

- Once a decade chance to count everyone in the country
- Sets the benchmark for all other demographic data
- Around \$7.5 billion of federal funds are distributed to Maine each year on the basis of census data

- For the first time, people can self-respond online, by phone, or by mail
- Census workers take a lifetime oath not to reveal any personal information violating this oath results in a fine of up to \$250,000 and five years in prison
