



### GINI Index


- Measure of Income Inequality


## Percent of Population Below Poverty Level

Maine: 17.2%


## Percent of Population Below Poverty Level in Married-Couple Families

United States: 6.4%




#### Percent of Married-Couple Families by Income Level




### **Population Age 25+ below Poverty Level by Educational Attainment**




#### **Median Earnings by Educational Attainment**

## Supplemental Poverty Measure

 Takes into account many of the government assistance programs not included in official poverty measure

▶ 3-year measure (2014-2016)

U.S. Official: 13.7%; SPM: 14.7%

Maine Official: 13.2%; SPM: 11.6%
