

Population increase of 2.6% from 2010-2020 (42nd in **U.S.**)


Population increase of 2.4% from 2020-2023 (14th in U.S.)


> 2023 net migration = 8.2 per thousand (9th in U.S.)













Percent of Households Unable to Afford Median Home, 2022






The diversity index tells us the chance that two people selected at random will be from different race or ethnicity groups


- In 2020, Maine ranked as the least diverse state in the U.S.
 - ME index = 18.5
 - U.S. index = 61.1
- But there is regional variation:
 Cumberland, Androscoggin, and
 Washington counties are more diverse




Race and/or ethnicity is not the same as place of birth


Maine has the highest...

...and was one of only four states to not see an increase from 2021 to 2022



Baby Boom generation in 2022: age 58-76




Health Insurance Coverage of the Population, 2022


Maine Civilian Labor Force





Labor Force Participation Rate



2022 Labor Force Participation Rate





Civilian Noninstitutional Population by Age, 2022

Share of Total Maine Population by Age






Unemployed Persons per Job Opening Ratio - Maine





Total Nonfarm Employment (in thousands) History and CEFC forecast




Share of Maine Nonfarm Employment by Industry

expected to be the largest)




Healthcare & Social Assistance Private Employment in Maine (2022)

Retirements: will some pandemic-era retirees rejoin the workforce?


<u>Wages</u>: inflation is slowing, but labor markets remain tight - how will wage expectations adjust?

The Great Reshuffle: how does the search for "better" work pan out in the long run?


<u>Automation</u>: will employers who struggle to find workers substitute with technology?


Quarterly Real GDP (in millions of chained 2012 dollars)



Maine Real GDP by Industry, 2002-2022 (in millions of chained 2012 dollars)




Moving Four Quarter Average Wage Per Job




Wages increased sharply during the first part of the pandemic, but higher inflation has flattened out recent gains


















Components of Personal Current Transfer Receipts, Maine

Federal supports including stimulus payments and Child Tax Credit played a role in reducing poverty in 2021; expiration of those supports caused poverty to rise in 2022


National Supplemental Poverty Measure (SPM) = 12.4%, 4.6 percentage points higher than 2021 and the first increase in the overall rate since 2010

The SPM child poverty rate more than doubled from 5.2% in 2021 to 12.4% in 2022


Social Security is the most significant antipoverty program, moving 28.9 million people nationally out of poverty as measured by the SPM

In Maine, the 3-year average SPM for 2020-2022 was 4.6%, 4.3 percentage points below the official poverty rate of 8.9% and the lowest in the nation


Median Household Income




Year-over-year percent change in Consumer Price Index

Most of the Budget Goes Toward **Defense, Social Security, and Major Health Programs**






Federal and State spending on healthcare
