Subject: Notice of Revocation of Registry Identification Card(s)

Dear Mr. Huang,

The Maine Department of Administrative & Financial Services, Office of Cannabis Policy (Department) is responsible for the administration and oversight of the Maine Medical Use of Cannabis Program (MMMP). Protection for authorized conduct requires compliance with the Maine Medical Use of Cannabis Act and program rules. Pursuant to its authority under 22 M.R.S., Chapter 558-C, §2430-F, the Department revokes the following Registry Identification Card(s): Yun Jian Huang **CGR30557**. Such revocations are effective three (3) calendar days after the date of this notice.

I. Justification for revocation:

The Department's decision to revoke your Registry Identification Card(s) is based on your violation of the Maine Medical Use of Marijuana Act. More specifically, the Department's MMMP field investigation staff have provided the Department with sufficient evidence to demonstrate the following statutory and regulatory violations:

- On 02-14-2022, Investigator Fred Luce went to Yezi Craft Cannabis at 201 Norridgewock Road in Fairfield, Maine. Investigator found you, Xiao Dong Zhang and Dustin Veinott at the facility. Investigator Luce found that you were registered with the Department as a caregiver, but that you were not a registered caregiver assistant. Investigator Luce found that you had a registered grow at 201 Norridgewock Road in Fairfield, which allowed you 500 square feet of canopy and 60 immature plants. Investigator Luce found that Mr. Zhang was not a registered caregiver or caregiver assistant with the Department. Investigator Luce found that Mr. Veinott was an expired caregiver and was not registered as a caregiver assistant with the Department.
- Mr. Veinott admitted that he was hired as the "Head Grower" at 201 Norridgewock Road by Sheng Cheng Ye. Veinott told Investigator Luce that he had been trimming plants in

one of the grow room when Investigator Luce arrived. You later admitted that all the plants at 201 Norridgewock Road were your plants. Mr. Veinott was not registered with the Department as your caregiver assistant and therefore was not allowed to assist you with your plants or allowed to have access to your grow.

- While speaking with Mr. Veinott, Investigator Dan Summers witnessed you making a sale of cannabis products to a customer inside of Mr. Ye's retail store. You are not registered with the Department as Mr. Ye's caregiver assistant and therefore were prohibited from selling his products and from having access to his retail storefront.
- Investigator Luce conducted a caregiver inspection of you at this time. You informed Investigator Luce that the retail store was Mr. Ye's, that you sell your flower in the store and Mr. Ye sells all the other products. Again, you were not registered with the Department as Mr. Ye's caregiver assistant and are were prohibited from selling Mr. Ye's products and from having access to Mr. Ye's retail storefront.
- During his inspection of your grow rooms, Investigator Luce found that you had 730.5 square feet of flowering canopy in your grow rooms. Your caregiver license only allows you to have 500 square feet of flowering canopy in four grow rooms.
- Investigator Luce asked to see your patient transaction logs and you could not provide any patient transaction logs. You produced a Yezi price sheet, which had a space at the top for the customer to write their name and their card number. The customer then circled the items that they wanted to purchase. These sheets were then piled in one large pile in the safe, which were comingled with Mr. Ye's transactions. There was no way to tell who sold what product. The sales sheets did not have a date or time in which the sale took place. Investigator Luce found some sheets that only had the customers first name only.
- Investigator Luce found that Mr. Ye had a large quantity of flower stored in a back room of 201 Norridgewock Road, which had an unlocked door and was easily accessible to any of the individuals on the premise. Investigator Luce also found that your grow room doors in the back were unlocked as well as the doors to your drying rooms, which allowed unvetted access to your cannabis plants and flower product. In addition, your storage room was unlocked and contained 79 five-gallon buckets plus 24 turkey bags of processed cannabis, as well as 5 lines of hanging cannabis. It was very apparent to investigator Luce that everyone had access to all areas of the property at 201 Norridgewock Road.
- Investigator Luce asked you to see all your wholesale transaction records and you advised that you did not have any wholesale transaction records.
- Investigator found that you were selling flower to patients in mylar bags which had a clear pane, was not tamper evident and child resistant. You did not have any exit bags that were opaque or child resistant in which you could place the flower bags into for the final sale.
- You advised Investigator Luce that you and Mr. Zhang both resided at [REDACTED], but you had registered [REDACTED], with the Department as your place of residence.
- On 03-31-2022, Investigator Luce went to Yezi Craft Cannabis. When Investigator Luce arrived, he found Mr. Veinott working on your plants. Mr. Veinott was not registered with the Department as your caregiver assistant and therefore was not allowed to assist

you with your plants or allowed to have access to your grow. Investigator Luce had advised you on 02-14-2022 that Mr. Veinott was not registered with the Department as your caregiver assistant and therefore was not allowed to assist you with your plants or allowed to have access to your grow. Room 3 contained 312 sq ft of your canopy grow. In addition, Room 6 contained 364 square feet of canopy grow which you denied was yours, even though you claimed the plants at 201 Norridgewock Road were your grow on 2.14.22, including those in Room 6.

For these reasons, your eligibility to participate in the MMMP has been revoked.

- **22 M.R.S.A. § 2423-A (3)(B)** Allowing unauthorized access to cultivation location and failing to adequately secure a cultivation area from unauthorized access.
- **22 M.R.S.A. § 2425-A (2)** Expired or unregistered caregiver assistants
- **22 M.R.S.A. § 2423-A (2)(B)** Plant canopy exceeding 500 square feet
- **22 M.R.S.A. § 2430-G(1)(A)(2)** Failure to retain records for 4 years
- **22 M.R.S.A. §2430-G(1)(A)(1)** Failure to keep adequate records of all transfers or harvested cannabis
- **22 M.R.S.A. § 2429-A (1)(A)** Packaging not tamper evident/child resistant
- **22 M.R.S.A. §2429-A (1)(B)** Packaging not opaque
- **18-691 CMR Ch. 2 § 10 (1)(4)** Illegal practices or unauthorized conduct, including failure to notify of change of address, and operating a caregiver retail store with no registration or notice to the Department to do so

II. Registration Revocation and Right to Request an Informal Hearing:

Pursuant to 22 M.R.S. §2430-F, the Department may suspend or revoke a registry identification card for violation of Chapter 558-C and the rules adopted by the Department. A person who has had authorization for conduct under Chapter 558-C revoked due to failure to comply with Chapter 558-C and rules adopted by the Department may request an informal hearing. If you would like to request an informal hearing, please notify the Department in writing within thirty (30) calendar days of the revocation effective date at the address information provided above. A request for an informal hearing should be sent to Vernon Malloch, Deputy Director of Operations by email at

Vernon.Malloch@maine.gov or USPS at 162 State House Station, 19 Union Street, Augusta, Maine 04333-0062. If the Department does not receive a hearing request in accordance with the policy, the revocation becomes final.
