**Subject: Notice of Revocation of Registry Identification Card(s)**

The Maine Department of Administrative & Financial Services, Office of Cannabis Policy (Department) is responsible for the administration and oversight of the Maine Medical Use of Cannabis Program (MMCP). Protection for authorized conduct requires compliance with the Maine Medical Use of Cannabis Act and program rules. Pursuant to its authority under 22 M.R.S., Chapter 558-C, §2430-F, the Department revokes the following Registry Identification Card(s): CGR 31312. Such revocations are effective three (3) calendar days after the date of this notice.

**I. Justification for revocation:**

The Department’s decision to revoke your Registry Identification Card(s) is based on your violation of the Maine Medical Use of Cannabis Act. More specifically, the Department’s MMCP field investigation staff have provided the Department with sufficient evidence to demonstrate the following statutory and regulatory violations:

1. On March 27, 2023, Field Investigator (FI) Daniel Summers sent you an email with an attached questionnaire to begin correspondence with you and to schedule an upcoming caregiver inspection. After leaving several voicemails and text messages and receiving no response, FI Summers discovered you shared the same address and cultivation site with another caregiver. On September 22, 2022, you contacted the Department and changed your mailing address [REDACTED] to your home/cultivation/manufacturing [REDACTED]. The address on your registry ID card is [REDACTED].
2. On April 5, 2023, Field Investigators Summers and Wade Maddox visited your listed address, [REDACTED], and cultivation site and conducted a caregiver inspection with this other caregiver. The caregiver stated that you had moved from the area back in the fall of 2022. The caregiver did not know where you had moved to and hadn’t heard from you since then.
3. FI Summers checked public information for new contact information. FI Summers found an address in Bangor ([REDACTED]) that you are associated with. FI Fred Luce checked this address on April 12, 2023, but you were not there. FI Luce left a business card at the address. FI Luce told FI Summers on May 2, 2023, he was contacted by your attorney, Matt Dubois. FI Luce explained to Mr. Dubois that OCP was trying to contact you to set up an inspection, but Mr. Dubois had no other contact information than what OCP had on file.

4. On May 12, 2023, FI Summers called your listed phone number again and left a message for a return call. Once again, no response from you. FI Summers found the mailing address listed on your application as [REDACTED]. FI Summers enlisted the help of FI Kurt Bosse who is assigned to that area of the state. FI Bosse researched this address and learned that this was not a residence or an apartment but rather a P.O. Box.
5. On May 15, 2023, the Office of Cannabis Policy sent you a Final Notice of Inspection. You were instructed to arrange for an inspection by contacting FI Summers by May 18, 2023, using the information provided to you.
6. On May 22, 2023, FI Summers, again, called your listed phone number and left a message for a return call. As of May 24, 2023, FI Summers has not heard back from you. Since September of 2022, you have not contacted OCP with any new address, or change of contact information.

**II. For these reasons, your eligibility to participate in the MMCP has been revoked:**

1. Refusing or willfully avoiding 2 or more inspections, a violation of 22 M.R.S.A. Section 2430-G(2)(C).
2. Failure to notify OCP that information on your registry ID card is inaccurate or has changed and submit the required fee for a new card, a violation of 22 M.R.S.A. § 2425-A (11)(B).

**III. Registration Revocation and Right to Request an Administrative Hearing:**

Pursuant to 22 M.R.S. §2430-F, the Department may suspend or revoke a registry identification card for violation of Chapter 558-C and the rules adopted by the Department. A person who has had authorization for conduct under Chapter 558-C revoked due to failure to comply with Chapter 558-C and rules adopted by the Department may request an administrative hearing. If you would like to request an administrative hearing, please notify the Department in writing within thirty (30) calendar days of the revocation effective date at the address information provided above. A request for an administrative hearing should be sent to Vernon Malloch, Deputy Director of Operations, by email at [Vernon.Malloch@maine.gov](mailto:Vernon.Malloch@maine.gov) or USPS at 162 State House Station, 19 Union Street, Augusta, Maine 04333-0062. If the Department does not receive a hearing request in accordance with the policy, the revocation becomes final.
