Revised the qualifications for expanded function dental assistant licensure consistent with statutory requirements. Revised and moved the requirements for licensure by endorsement and to renew into Chapter 11.
<u>Chapter 4</u> – Qualifications for Dental Radiography Licensure	Revised the qualifications for licensure consistent with statutory requirements. Revised and moved the requirements for licensure by endorsement and to renew into Chapter 11.
<u>Chapter 5</u> – Qualifications for Denturist Licensure	Deleted denturist externship permit as the licensure category was repealed in the Dental Practice Act. Revised the qualifications for denturist licensure consistent with statutory requirements. Revised and moved the qualifications for licensure by endorsement and to renew into Chapter 11.
<u>Chapter 6</u> – Qualifications for Dentist Licensure	Deleted dentist externship permit as the licensure categories was repealed in the Dental Practice Act. Revised the qualifications for licensure and licensure categories consistent with statutory requirements. Revised and moved the requirements for licensure by endorsement and to renew into Chapter 11.
<u>Chapter 8</u> – Qualifications for Initial and Renewal Registrations	Identifies the requirements for the initial and renewal of licensees registered with the Board to complete supervised, clinical experience in the categories of sedation, local anesthesia and nitrous oxide analgesia. Identifies the requirements for a denturist trainee consistent with the Dental Practice Act.

<u>Chapter 9</u> – Unprofessional Conduct	Deleted the complaint process from rule. Deleted the limitation of a dentist's scope of practice by rule. Revised sections of unprofessional conduct and moved them into Chapter 12.
<u>Chapter 10</u> – Sexual Misconduct	Revised the sexual misconduct section.
Chapter 11 – Qualifications for Licensure by Endorsement; Requirements for Renewal, Late Renewal and Reinstatement of Licensure and Authorities	Identifies the requirements for licensure by endorsement, requirements to renew and reinstate licenses, and requirements for dental hygiene practice authorities consistent with statutory requirements.
Chapter 12 – Practice Requirements	Identifies the practice requirements of individuals licensed under the Dental Practice Act in the following areas: • General practice requirements such as infection control; radiation protection; adherence to local, state and federal health and safety regulations; emergency protocols; dental adverse reporting; and controlled substances and inventory control • Patient record requirements that include recordkeeping requirements, content of a patient record, informed consent, progress notes, and financial records • Requirements for proper patient dismissal; practice sale and closure notification • Specific practice requirements when utilizing nitrous oxide analgesia • Specific practice requirements when utilizing certain materials, laser and digital equipment • Specific practice requirements for IDPH practice consistent with statutory requirements • Specific practice requirements for a referral network, after hour patient care, and when deviating from a practice standard • Adoption of principles of ethics and codes of professional conduct for dentists, dental hygienists and denturists
