The Veazie Salmon Club writes today with heavy hearts and a deep sense of urgency. The proposed expansion of the Juniper Ridge Landfill, with its continued practice of discharging waste effluent into the Penobscot River, strikes at the very soul of our community and the natural world that sustains us.

For generations, the Atlantic Salmon of our home river have fought their way upstream to spawn, to create life, and to continue a cycle as old as the river itself.
