BOARD ORDER

#00-4892-11020) FINDINGS OF FACT AND ORDER

After reviewing the project file of the Board's Approval, pursuant to 38 M.R.S.A. § 483, 1301, et. seq., of the application of Statler Industries Incorporated to establish a paper mill sludge disposal site in Augusta, and, pursuant to the record of that application, under the provisions of Title 38, M.R.S.A. § 421, the Board finds the following facts:

1. In its application for approval by the Board (DEP Project #00-4892-11020), Statler Industries Inc. requested a permit to dispose of solid waste within 300 feet of a classified body of water, under the provisions of Title 38, M.R.S.A. § 421.
2. At the Public Hearing held by the Board on May 3, 1979 in Augusta, Statler Industries Inc. reiterated its request for a permit to dispose of solid waste within 300 feet of a classified body of water, under the provisions of Title 38, M.R.S.A. § 421.
3. The Board approved with conditions the application of Statler Industries Inc. pursuant to Title 38, M.R.S.A. § 483 and 1301 et. seq. in its Order of June 27, 1979.
4. Paper mill wastewater sludge will be disposed in a contained landfill. The sludge will be underlain by practically impermeable glaciomarine silt clay sediment. Leachate generated from the sludge will be collected and transported by pipeline to the Augusta Sanitary District Wastewater Treatment Plant, where it will be treated prior to discharge to the Kennebec River.
5. The paper mill wastewater sludge landfill will be within 300 feet of tributaries to Riggs Brook. Riggs Brook is a tributary to the Kennebec River. Riggs Brook and its tributaries are Classified Bodies of Water, pursuant to Title 38, M.R.S.A. § 368, Kennebec River Basin--Minor Tributaries below Wyman Dam in Moscow, (1).

Based on the above Findings of Fact, the Board concludes that:

1. The deposit of solid waste at this site within 300 feet of a Classified Body of water, under the terms of the Board's Order of June 27, 1979, will not result in an unlicensed direct or indirect discharge of pollutants to such body of water.

THEREFORE, the Board approves the request of Statler Industries Inc. to dispose of solid waste within 300 feet of a Classified Body of Water in Augusta, Maine subject to the following conditions:

1. The Standard Conditions of Approval, a copy attached.
2. Statler Industries Inc. shall comply with the terms of the Board's Order of June 27, 1979.

3. This approval shall be for a term of two years, and may be renewed for successive two year terms after re-examination.
