Commissioner and Ms. Butler,

I am writing to correct certain information contained in the Waste Management Crossroads Landfill Expansion-Application for Public Benefit, #S-010735-W5-XY-N. On page 12 Section 1.4 of the above referenced Application of Public Benefit, Waste Management states:

“Crossroads also recently entered into an agreement with Fiberight to send MSW bridge capacity waste to Penobscot Energy Recovery Company (“PERC”)”.


As an owner of the PERC facility, I can state factually that there is no such agreement in place. The only agreement that PERC entered into with the MRC/Fiberight project was in January 2018. In that agreement, the MRC was to release approximately 62,000 tons of unprocessed msw from the contractual obligation to be delivered to the Crossroads landfill. This material was to be instead delivered to PERC for processing.

The effectiveness of this signed agreement was conditioned on the approval from Waste Management to allow the msw to be processed as an alternative to land disposal at the Crossroads facility.

Waste Management did not approve the proposed MRC agreement that would have allowed the 62,000 tons of msw to be processed at PERC. Consequently all of the MRC tons (approximately 100,000 annually) are currently be disposed at Crossroads and the Juniper Ridge landfills.
