Mr. Pentaleri,

Thank you for your additional comments. I understand that one of your concerns is about the type of permit being reviewed. I will try to clarify. An "individual" NRPA permit, also known as a "full" NRPA permit, is simply a reference to the level of permit based on the type of activity, and not on the type of applicant. The term "individual" is meant to distinguish this permit from an NRPA Permit by Rule (which is generally for smaller or more standard projects) and an NRPA Tier permit (which is only for freshwater wetland alterations). The applicant for an individual NRPA permit may be an individual person, a corporation, a non-profit, a municipality, a Land Trust, or any other type of person or organization that has title, right, or interest in the land on which the proposed activities will take place. In the event that the land is owned by an individual but the proposed activity or structure is for the benefit of a legal entity, the Department finds it acceptable for either the landowner or the legal entity to be named as the applicant.

Mr. Spinney has provided evidence of title, right, or interest in the property proposed for use and this evidence has been found sufficient for the Department to accept the application for review. The project under review is a shared-use pier and boat ramp. The Department does not approve new permanent boat ramps for the sole use of private individual landowners and their households. To establish that the structures will be truly for shared use, the Department has required further information from the applicant about the recreation club and the means of legal access for the club to the proposed structures. The applicant has provided this information and the Department's review of this information is ongoing.

The other concerns you raise are being carefully considered by the Department. Your comments will be added to the Department's record. The full record is available to be viewed at any time. To view the record, please contact our File Room at 287-7843.
