

## ***SECTION 8: Historic Sites***

### *Project Overview*

The project proposes to construct an enclosed recirculating aquaculture system (RAS) facility at 9 Dun Garvin Road. The site, encompassing 93 acres, has wetlands and a variety of land cover. In addition, the project will construct a seawater intake and outfall in the adjacent waterbody, Chandler Bay.

### *Historic Sites Summary*

The property, location off Mason Bay Road (Route 187) is on the coast of Chandler Bay, and has been used for several prior uses. The property is limited in its prior development to mid-century or later structures which are modest. No buildings exist on the property that are of a character or nature to identify as historic. A review of the federal register indicates the closest listed historical site is ~3 miles to the south in downtown Jonesport. Appended to this section are photographs of existing structures and a letter from Kirk Mohney of the Maine Historic Preservation Commission stating there are no registered historic properties on the site.
