(Sunset Mat), we have been building mats for the NECEC project for the past year and have made numerous investments to continue building mats for this project. We have invested in a \$200,000 sawmill, \$45,000 drill, currently have \$80,000 in inventory for logs and employed 5 extra people due to this project. We have seen the effects of this project even as far north as Milford.

Our company has been making construction mats which are required to protect the area being disturbed by construction vehicles.
