*H* Parcel No. 1. A strip of land four hundred (400) feet in width extending from my northerly to my southerly line and bounded northerly by land now or formerly of Willis Gould; easterly by a line parallel with and sixty-two and one-half (62 $\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet easterly of the survey line now staked out across my lot, the Gould lot and the Wilson lot; southerly by land now or formerly of Cliftor R. Wilson; westerly by a line parallel with and three hundred thirty-seven and one-half (337 $\frac{1}{2}$ ) feet westerly of the survey line above described. Being a portion of the Trask lot, so-called, and containing about nine and fifty-four hundredths (9.54) acres. My title to the above lot was derived by deed from Roscoe E. Heirs and Assigns forever, all my right, title and interest  
in and to a certain tract or parcel of land, with the buildings  
thereon, situate in said Leeds, said land is bounded and known  
as the easterly half of Lot #22, excepting a strip of land  
thirty (30) rods by eighty (80) rods on the south side of said  
lot. Meaning to convey thirty-five (35) acres in the east and  
north of said half lot, including the highway passing thru the  
said half lot in the survey.

This deed is given for the purpose of correcting an error  
on the records of the Androscoggin Registry of Deeds, because  
of the fact that the deed from the said B. C. & A. L. Thomas to  
the within named Grantor, dated April 24, 1921, and recorded  
in Book 406, Page 126, signed by A. L. Thomas, Annie E. Thomas






