My dear Getchell:

I enclose memorandum in connection with the right of way in (Monrouth) which the Central Securities Corporation purchased from Charles F. Wight October 22, 1930. This is the matter, about which we have just talked by telephone.

John E. McCarthy of Lewiston has recently purchased a farm from Wight. The deed recites that his purchase is subject to the right of way. On examining the record of the deed from Wight to the Central Securities Corporation, Mr. McCarthy found that it contained no reservation of the wood and lumber, although he understood that it was in fact reserved. Mr. Wight explained it to him as I did to you and gave him the original memorandum written entirely and signed by Mr. Hisler.

Mr. McCarthy is now cutting the lumber on the farm and expects to sell the farm with the lumber removed. The purchaser will expect to remove the cordwood at his convenience but subject, so far as the right of way is concerned, to the limitation that it must be done before the Power Company wishes to use the remainder of the remainder of the area for its purposes.

This letter and enclosed memorandum will serve as an explanation for whomsoever comes after you and me.

The following is copy of paper made and signed in Mr. Hisler's handwriting with per and ink. This relates to right of way conveyed by Charles F. Wight to Central Securities Corporation. The story is that Mr. Hisler negotiated with Wight for the purchase with the understanding that he retain the right to remove the wood.

When the deed was presented to him this privilege was not found in it and he objected to signing without it. Mr. Hisler gave him the memorandum instead of having the deed rewrittn.

This comes to my attention this morning through John E. McCarthy, who has purchased the premises over which the right of way runs, by deed from Charles F. Wight dated October 7, 1940, and is now cutting wood on the premises so purchased.

I have just telephoned the circumstances to Mr. W. B. Getchell, agent, who assured me that he would make a memorandum of the fact in the company's real estate book and for Mr. McCarthy to proceed with the removal of the wood as agreed by Mr. Hisler. I promised to send Mr. Getchell a copy of the Hisler memorandum with this explanation of the transaction for his files.
