Thank you for your time and consideration of this and all matters before the board.

As you are aware, over 80% of testimony received by the board was in opposition to this rule change. Since that time, electric vehicle makers have chosen to drastically cut manufacturing of electric vehicles due to lack of demand and insufficient availability of resources and components. In addition, Tesla recently announced a recall of 2 million electric vehicles. Even if there were no other considerations, the lack of reliable, consistent, and high quality supply, in and of itself, is reason that this rule change is infeasible and irrational.
