Madam Chair and members of the Board, my name is Jonathan Martell from Sanford. I would like to express my Opposition of the proposed rules.

Electric vehicles are dangerous for Mainers and should not be made mandatory in any manner.

First, most Maine fire departments are not properly equipped to handle battery fires that often spread to other vehicles and are nearly impossible to extinguish.
