



Maine Electronic Waste Recycling Program Manufacturer Registration

Application for market share credits

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection's Chapter 415: *Reasonable Costs for Handling, Transportation, and Recycling of Electronic Waste* provides two ways by which manufacturers may obtain credit against their pounds marketed for the purpose of calculating Maine recycling shares:

- pounds collected in Maine through a manufacturer's qualifying takeback program, and
- pounds marketed that are EPEAT certified.

To apply for credit pounds to be used in calculating 2020 recycling shares, complete this form based on calendar year 2018 activities, and submit no later than April 1, 2019.

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A. Takeback credit pounds

To obtain credit for pounds collected in Maine and recycled via a manufacturer’s takeback program, please provide the following program details:

- Description of collection, including:
 - o How and/or where electronics are collected.
 - o How the program distinguishes pounds collected from covered entities in Maine from other pounds collected.
 - o How the program ensures collection is free
- Description of data collection and material tracking procedures, including the manner of arriving at any estimates of refurbishment.
- Schematic of where materials are sent for recycling.
 - o Include all possible downstream outlets, the types of material sent to each, the types of material produced at each, and their downstream destinations until materials have been transformed into salable commodities or, where the production of salable commodities is not possible, disposed of in an environmentally sound manner;
 - o Include documentation of any certifications held by downstream entities or a signed copy of Maine’s Guidelines for the Environmentally Sound Management of Electronic Waste for each initial downstream outlet that does not possess either an R2 or eStewards certification.
 - o If materials are refurbished by an entity that does not possess an R2 certification, provide documentation to demonstrate that the recycler meets or exceeds R2 standards and that the manufacturer provides auditing at least equivalent to that provided as part of R2 certification.

Note: Only recycling of covered electronic devices can be credited. Covered electronic devices include: desktop printers (including 3D printers), video game consoles, televisions (including portable DVD players), and other video display devices with screens greater than four inches measured diagonally and that contain one or more circuit boards (monitors, laptops, tablets, digital picture frames, and others).
