



Maine Electronic Waste Recycling Program Manufacturer Registration

Report for Calendar Year 2018

Maine's *Electronic Waste Law*, 38 M.R.S.A. §1610, requires manufacturers of certain electronics to annually register with the Maine Department of Environmental Protection and pay a registration fee by July 1.

Who must register?

Manufacturers of televisions (including portable DVD players) and video game consoles that are currently selling or sold their products during the previous calendar year.

Current and historic manufacturers of other covered electronic devices (for a full list of devices see "What products need to be registered?" below).

"Manufacturer" means a person who:

- (1) Manufactures or has manufactured a covered electronic device under its own brand or label;
- (2) Sells or has sold under its own brand or label a covered electronic device produced by other suppliers;
- (3) Imports or has imported a covered electronic device into the United States that is manufactured by a person without a presence in the United States; or
- (4) Owns a brand that it licenses or licensed to another person for use on a covered electronic device.

Manufacturers include any successor in interest to a historic manufacturer, i.e., any business which has assumed legal responsibility through purchase of the historic manufacturer's assets.

What is the registration fee?

Fees are \$3000, \$750, or \$0, depending on product sales. By June 1st of each year, the Maine DEP will send invoices to manufacturers that have previously registered with us. Manufacturers registering for the first time will receive invoices once the registration form is complete.

What products need to be registered?

Maine law requires the registration of the following products that could ultimately be sold to consumers, small businesses, nonprofits, or schools: desktop printers, video game consoles, cathode ray tube devices, flat panel displays or similar video display devices with a screen that is greater than 4 inches measured diagonally and that contains one or more circuit boards. 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D. IT Manufacturer handling option for computer monitors and desktop printers

If you are a manufacturer of a computer monitor (including a portable notebook computer, tablet, e-reader, all-in-one computer, and/or digital picture frame) or a manufacturer of a desktop printer, please select one of the following options for the handling, transportation, and recycling of your branded products:

- Standard plan** - Maine DEP-approved consolidators perform a brand count and contract for environmentally-sound management with a qualified recycling and dismantling facility, then bill the manufacturer for the costs associated with handling, transportation and recycling based on the weight of the manufacturer's products received plus the manufacturer's share of orphan products (if any).

-OR-

- Option 1** - The consolidators physically sort the manufacturer's product and bill the manufacturer for costs associated with transportation and "Option 1 handling" based on the weight of the manufacturer's products received plus the transportation handling and recycling of its share of orphan waste. **Additionally**, the manufacturer contracts with a recycler of their choice to pick up their product from the consolidator within 72 hours of being notified by the consolidator that there is enough product to fill a 40' trailer or annually (whichever is more frequent), and the manufacturer's selected recycler bills the manufacturer for the additional transportation and recycling.

The consolidators approved by the Maine Department of Environmental Protection to participate in Maine's extended producer responsibility program for e-waste will manage the handling, transportation, recycling and billing in accordance with the IT manufacturer's selected preference. Manufacturers must pay valid invoices from the DEP-approved consolidators within 90 days of receipt of such invoices. Manufacturers that select Option 1 must also pay invoices received from their selected recycler in accordance with the terms of their contract.
