



Surface Use Restriction Portion of Annabessacook Lake in Monmouth, Maine

Pursuant to 38 MRSA §1864, the Maine Departments of Environmental Protection (DEP) and Inland Fisheries and Wildlife (DIFW) hereby establish a temporary surface use restriction on a portion of the southwest corner of Annabessacook Lake in Monmouth. The approximately 47-acre restricted area is shown on the accompanying image and includes approximately 200 feet of Wilson Stream just upstream of the Waugan Road bridge.

The purpose of this surface use restriction is to enable effective suppression of the invasive aquatic plant variable-leaved water-milfoil (*Myriophyllum heterophyllum*) and to prevent spread of this plant in Annabessacook Lake during plant removal work in 2020.

By this Order, the restriction on watercraft during 2020 is as follows:

From April 15, 2020 through December 31, 2020, no watercraft of any type may enter or travel the southwest portion of Annabessacook Lake and the portion of Wilson Stream indicated on the image accompanying this order.

Exceptions to this Order are limited to boat travel 1) in emergency situations where property or human safety is endangered and 2) specifically allowed by the DEP or DIFW to survey for and remove invasive plants, deploy and retrieve fragment nets and buoys, and maintain fragment nets.

The restricted area extends from approximately 200 feet upstream of the Waugan Road bridge in an easterly direction into a portion of Annabessacook Lake. The restricted area encompasses the greatest extent and density of variable-leaved water-milfoil in the lake. Buoys labeled "Area Closed" will be deployed along the boundary of the restricted area in the lake.

Access to Wilson Stream west of the restricted area is possible across property owned by Ray Harps. Please call Mr. Harps at (207) 240-0651 to seek permission.

This surface use restriction is in effect unless canceled in writing by the Departments. The restriction may be extended beyond 2020 if the agencies deem it necessary to achieve the objectives of invasive aquatic plant removal in Annabessacook Lake.
