The Maine CDC WIC Nutrition Program may provide payment for electric breast pump rentals for exclusively breastfeeding mothers under certain circumstances or to partially breastfeeding mothers for short term attempts to increase milk supply. WIC agreed to pay for an electric breast pump for you and your baby based on need and your signed agreement.
