

Needle Exchange Program

- -First needle exchange program in the state of Maine
- -With 190,000 needles exchanged and 900 individuals seen in 2017, it is also the state's largest
- -Promotes harm reduction philosophies by:
 - Encouraging safer drug use behaviors
 - Offering HIV/Hep C testing on-site
 - Naloxone trainings and access
 - STD testing services and PrEP therapy
 - Abscess/infection prevention education
 - Referrals to primary care and MAT

Naloxone Distribution & Trainings

- -The needle exchange program started distributing naloxone in 2015
- -Since then, over 10,000 doses of naloxone have been distributed
- -Over 500 trainings have been given to social service agencies, clinics, groups and recovery programs
- -In 2017, there were 291 reported overdose reversals in the needle exchange program

There is a continuum of drug use; not all drug use is addiction



No Needle Exchange Programs

Number of Newly-Diagnosed HIV+ cases among people who inject drugs

since January 2015: 215

Declaring it a "Public Health Emergency", Gov. Mike Pence sanctioned a short-term needle exchange program to operate for one year.

Lawrence and Lowell, MA

There's been an increase in HIV infections in the Lawrence/Lowell area, which is believed to be caused by sharing injection equipment.

There were 52 new cases in this region in 2017, up from 32 in 2016.

CDC intervention specialists will conduct and investigation and interviews with infected individuals about needle sharing behaviors and sexual partners.

They will sequence genomes of viral samples to identify how closely related they are, and help find the groups of people through which the disease was transmitted.
