By September 30<sup>th</sup> 2008, a total of 34 new HIV diagnoses had been reported to the Maine CDC since January 1<sup>st</sup> 2008. 12 or 35% of the 34 new HIV diagnoses were concurrently diagnosed as AIDS cases. As shown in the table below, the most frequent mode of HIV transmission among 2008 year-to-date and prevalent diagnoses was through male-to-male sexual

Approximately 1,230 1 people are estimated to be living with diagnosed HIV infection in Maine as of 09/30/2008. About 55% of HIV positive individuals in Maine currently have a diagnosis of AIDS. In the table below, demographic characteristics for HIV diagnoses made to-date in 2008<sup>†</sup> are presented alongside similar characteristics for people living in Maine with a diagnosed HIV infection as of September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2008.
