Subject: Pfizer Vaccine Administration Recommendations

Date: December 1, 2021

As we have broadened our COVID-19 vaccination efforts to now include the pediatric 5 through 11-year-old population, we have also become acquainted with the new Pfizer vaccine formulation for this age group.

These two formulations are not interchangeable.



ORANGE CAP

Pediatric 5 through 11-year-old formulation

The Pediatric formulation comes with an orange cap and label and is a 10 mcg dose (injection volume is 0.2 mL).



PURPLE CAP

Adolescent/Adult 12 years and older formulation

The Adolescent/Adult formulation comes with a purple cap and label and is a 30 mcg dose (0.3 mL).

To avoid the potential for errors in administering these different formulations, we are recommending that clinicians:

- 1. Always confirm the patient's age prior to administration of vaccine, both verbally and by checking consent forms from parent/guardian.
- 2. Check your vials three times to make sure you have the correct vaccine in hand.
- 3. Confirm the correct dosage. Vaccine dosage is based on the patient's age, not their weight.
- 4. Document appropriately in ImmPact to ensure the patient receives the correct number of doses and extra doses are not given.

If a vaccine administration error is made, please take the following steps:

- Inform the recipient of the vaccine administration error.
- Consult with the Maine Immunization Program to see how the dose should be entered into ImmPact, both as an administered dose and to account for inventory.

- Providers are required to report all COVID-19 vaccine administration errors—even those
 not associated with an adverse event—to VAERS <u>VAERS Report an Adverse Event</u>
 (hhs.gov).
- Determine how the error occurred and implement strategies to prevent it from happening again.
