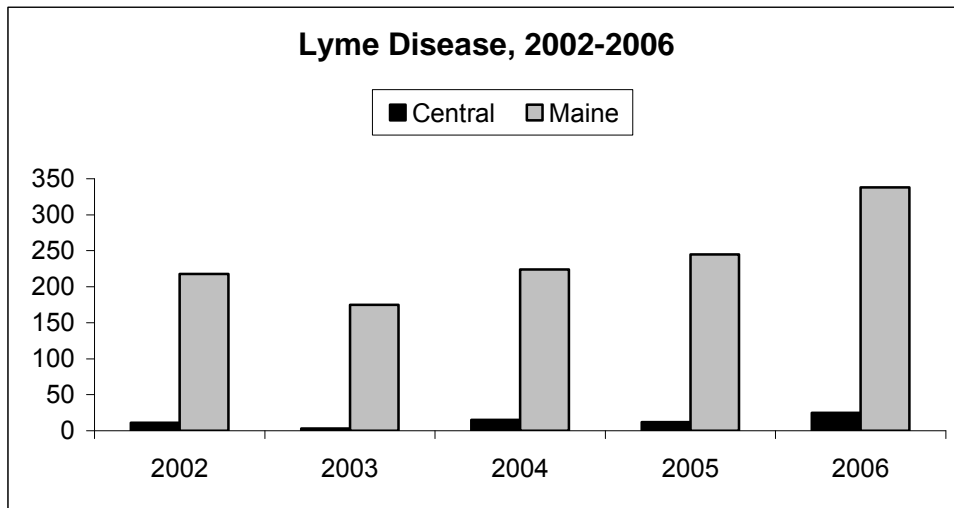


Lyme Disease

Lyme disease is a tick-borne illness that is a growing threat in Maine, with an average of about 240 reported cases per year in the last five years; the growth in cases is of increasing concern. People who get it most often are those who are outdoors in areas where ticks are found, children under 15, adults over 50, and people who have other illnesses that make it hard for them to fight off diseases.

A *Healthy People 2010* objective is to reduce the annual incidence of Lyme disease.
