Partners in Care Coordination is a unique resource for families, health care providers, and communities. PCC's goal is to help improve the health, development and well-being of Maine's children with special health needs



Who is eligible to receive *PCC*'s services?

Partners in Care Coordination is available to families with children from birth through age 21 that have, or are at risk for, chronic medical conditions, behavioral and emotional conditions.

How can *PCC* help children and their families?

Families can turn to *PCC* for support, information, and referral to community services and resources.

PCC has assisted with:

- Insurance appeals
- Serving as an advocate
- "Thinking outside the box"
- Finding ways to get specialized items covered
- Putting you in touch with parent supports
