



MAINE STATE LAW:

It is illegal for us to sell, furnish, give or deliver liquor to a person under 27 years of age without requiring an ID to verify the person is over 21.





MAINE STATE LAW:

It is unlawful for us to:

- ◆ **Sell liquor to a visibly intoxicated person**
- ◆ **Allow consumption of liquor by a visibly intoxicated person on this premise**
- ◆ **Allow a visibly intoxicated person to remain on this premise**





If we suspect an ID is fraudulent, we will refuse to complete that sale of alcohol.

We may also exercise our right under Maine state law to retain the ID and turn it over to law enforcement.





No Loitering or Illegal Activity

Law Enforcement will be notified.

**It is illegal for intoxicated individuals or
minors possessing alcohol to be on these premises.**



***Selling Brewing or Wine-Making
Equipment To Anyone Under 21
Years of Age Is Illegal***

In Maine it is a civil violation to knowingly sell, furnish, or give equipment that is used to brew, ferment, or make malt liquor or wine to someone under 21 years of age.
