Referral System Background

Community Care Referral System is an iteration of COVID-19 Social Supports Referral System:

- COVID-19 Social Supports Referral System was housed in Commissioner's
 Office at ME DHHS & operated from June 2020 through the end of December
 2022
- Utilized federal funding to provide COVID-positive Mainers with urgent COVID-related supports including grocery and household supplies delivery, support accessing tests, vaccines, and therapeutics, and support understanding CDC quarantine & isolation (Q&I) guidelines

Community Care Referral System

Community Care Referral System is housed in the Office of Population Health Equity (OPHE) at Maine CDC and went live in January 2023.

Goals:

- Increase access to social services for individuals statewide who might otherwise be unable to access them, or who might not know what services they're eligible for, especially services that are culturally and linguistically appropriate
- Enable community partners to collaborate with one another to better meet the diverse needs they encounter
- The referral system also provides DHHS with insight into the services organizations statewide provide and offers community organizations data to document and support their work

Community Care Referral System Process

- The Community Care Referral System engages with services organizations already provide; does not establish any new social services
- Referrals received through system are assessed and forwarded onto one or more organizations who can meet needs expressed
- Organization(s) expected to make initial contact in 1-3 days
- Referral System is capable of meeting culturally and linguistically specific needs by connecting Mainers seeking support with ethnic community-based organizations (ECBOs)

Community Care Referral Form Process, cont'd

- Community Care Referral Form is located online at <u>https://www.maine.gov/dhhs/mecdc/equity/community-care-referrals.shtml4</u>
- Anyone can submit a referral for themselves or others seeking social service supports
- Community Care Team engages in communication with organizations and individuals seeking support to ensure service provision follow through
