Sally Weiss, Vice President of Workforce Policy and Strategic Initiatives, Maine Hospital Association	 Briefing: Healthcare SDOH Requirements CMS is introducing a new requirement for hospitals to report on social determinants of health (SDOH). This will require hospitals to screen in-patients when they are admitted according to 5 SDOH factors: food insecurity; transportation; housing; utilities; and safety. There will be a year to collect the data before it has to be submitted to CMS. Currently, there is no requirement to provide referrals to services for patients, but that may be required in the future. This is a big lift for the 36 hospitals across the state. There are questions around who will do the screenings – but there are ways to screen, even if a person is incapacitated. Ellen Freedman discussed the out-patient screenings and referrals that MaineHealth has begun instituting, with the roll out of www.Findhelp.org which is integrated into the EMR.
