

Planning for Reaccreditation


- Will need to submit application in early 2021.
 - Will need to meet the next version of the PHAB standards (1.5)
 - Based on “shorter set” of Reaccreditation measures
 - Shorter turnaround time for document submission.
 - Virtual site visit.
- Reviewing original site visit report and Re-accreditation Standards.
 - Identifying gaps, and developing timelines to fill these.
