The Hepatitis Free Northern New England tri-state collaborative (Hep Free NNE) 2025-2030 Viral Hepatitis B and C Elimination Plan sets a course to eliminate hepatitis B and C across Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont. It emphasizes community-driven strategies, aligning with local needs and resources. The effort was fueled by contributions from over 200 co-creators and stakeholders and is aligned with the National Strategy for Viral Hepatitis and federal implementation plan.

Strategies

Micro-Elimination: Centers localized strategies adapted to specific priority populations. This tailored model is designed to deliver faster, more impactful results while inspiring broader change.

Collaborative Planning: Involves multi-sector partners, ensuring inclusivity, community input, and alignment with public health priorities.

Goals

Achieve hepatitis B and C elimination through:

- Increased testing and treatment access across diverse settings.
- Normalized conversations about hepatitis to reduce stigma.
- Integrated care within broader health and social systems like housing and substance use programs.
- Strengthened public health infrastructure with innovative funding and advocacy.
