
MELANOMA SURVIVORS SINCE 2001<sup>1</sup>

Melanoma is the <u>**not</u>** a leading cause of cancer death.</u>

The 5-year relative survival is **93.4%**.<sup>2</sup>

Maine ranks <u>25th</u> in the US for melanoma 5-year survival rate.<sup>3</sup>

people diagnosed at a localized stage will survive at least 5 years (vs 3 in 10 at a distant stage).<sup>5</sup>

### **Risk Factors**

- Sun exposure
- Race (white)
- Having many or abnormal moles
- Having fair complextion (blue or green eyes, blonde or red hair)

Talk to your doctor if you are at increased risk of skin cancer or if there are any unusual changes in your skin or moles.<sup>4</sup>


# Combined 5-year estimate (2018-2022)

### MAINE CDC COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM


