
PROSTATE CANCER SURVIVORS SINCE 2001¹

Prostate cancer is the <u>4th</u> leading cause of cancer death.

The 5-year relative survival is **95.8%**.²

Maine ranks <u>33rd</u> in the US for prostate cancer 5-year survival rate.³



MAINE CDC CANCER REGISTRY



MAINE CDC COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM


