- Cases reported in 10 out of 16 counties.
- Highest number (22) of rabid animals from Cumberland County.

Keep rabies vaccinations up-to-date for all dogs, cats, and ferrets Feed pets indoors and keep garbage cans and other food sources tightly secured

After an animal exposure:

- Clean all wounds with soap and water for 15 minutes
- Call your local Animal Control Officer or Game Warden
- For human exposures, contact a healthcare provider
- For pet & livestock exposures, contact a veterinarian

Avoid contact with wildlife or any animals you do not know
