## Update on Selected Priorities and Activities since the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment - Aroostook County

In response to the 2022 Community Health Need Assessment (CHNA) along with community input, hospitals and local districts developed their own three-year strategies and plans. Below are these organization's updates on their selected priorities and activities since the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment. The Community Action Programs developed their plans in response to community input and their 2022 Community Needs Assessment. One full year of implementation has taken place to date in 2023, 2024 implementation work is currently underway with 2025 work on the horizon for implementation activity on these identified priorities.

For a number of organizations listed in this document priority work spans across multiple counties throughout Maine though their physical location may be in one county.

Cancer	In 2023 Cary Medical Center and Pines Health Services provided smoking cessation kits, and promoted low-dose CT screening as well as other screenings like mammography and colonoscopies. Screen Aroostook was also an avenue to education on radon and lung cancer risk. We also continued to grow the Pink Aroostook program and hosted several fundraisers and events for breast cancer support in the County. We hosted a cancer support group. PSAs and advertising through local media and social media aired highlighting new screening equipment like our CT and MRI, as well as the importance of regular screenings and check-ups for early detection. Dr. Elena Vagia, oncologist joined the Jefferson Cary Cancer Center. We have also increased promotion of the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program.
