What do I need to bring to my first WIC appointment?

Women, infants and children applying for WIC must be present at the first visit. You also need to bring the following:

Proof of income eligibility

If you receive MaineCare, SNAP, or TANF, you must bring one of the following:

- □ MaineCare card or eligibility letter for all persons applying for WIC
- □ SNAP enrollment or renewal letter
- □ TANF statement

Income for all household members for the past 30 days. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Pay stubs for the last 30 days
- □ Military earning statements/Leave and Earnings Statement (LES)
- Pay statement from employer
- □ Child support or alimony agreement
- Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) statement

Proof of where you live (your physical address, not a P.O. box). Examples include:

- Utility bill in your name, matching your given address
- □ Mail with your name and address on it
- □ Driver's license with your street address
- □ Rental agreement or mortgage paper with your name and address
- □ TANF statement, MaineCare card
- □ SNAP enrollment or renewal letter

Proof of identification for everyone applying for WIC. Examples include:

- MaineCare card
- Driver's license
- □ SSID card
- □ School or Employer ID card
- □ State issued ID card
- Passport
- □ Birth certificate
- □ Hospital crib card
- Vaccination record
