## What is 317?

Section 317 of the Public Health Service Act authorizes the federal purchase of vaccines to vaccinate children, adolescents, and adults.

Over its 50-year history, 317-purchased vaccine has been directed towards meeting the needs of priority populations; most recently this has been under and uninsured adults.

317 vaccine plays a critical role in achieving national immunization coverage targets and reductions in disease for adults.

## Eligibility



### 19 years of age or older

AND:

✓ Uninsured

✓ Underinsured

(i.e., has health insurance that does not pay for immunizations)



This does not include:

- Patients with deductibles that must be satisfied before coverage kicks in, or
- Patients that must receive vaccines at a pharmacy

MaineCare patients do <u>not</u> qualify.

Reduce/delay order? ... Send us an email!

Requested orders will be approved case-by-case, depending on previous vaccine usage, compliance, and available funds.

Orders will be placed on the second Wednesday of each month.

On the date of ordering, your site must:

- 1. Reconcile your site's inventory
- 2. Update your site's cold chain

\*\*Must be completed on the same day orders are placed, between 12:01am and 11:00am
