

Summary Report of COVID-19 Assessments: Adult Family Care Homes (6/3/20)

These data represent a ‘snapshot’ in time. Assessments were by phone and occurred over several days during the week of April 20-28, 2020. Case counts were as of Friday that week. Epidemiology Program data used for facility case counts (grey).

Group activities have not been suspended; facilities report they are maintaining a 6-foot distance during group activities	Stakeholder meetings targeted to this group of providers were initiated on May 12, and guidance addressing issue has been disseminated.	OADS
Universal precautions such as hand hygiene and the use PPE are limited. One facility report’s that they have no idea if staff perform hand hygiene.		
Lack of certain types of PPE is problematic in these facilities particularly lack of gowns, masks (mostly cloth), EPA and ABHS		
Disinfecting common areas with EPA and/or other disinfectant is minimal		
Communal meals continue – few residents able to maintain the 6-foot distance		
Conducting hand hygiene and proper use of PPE audits are limited
