

Aquaculture Harvester License and Reporting Requirements



Important Reminders

- Your LPA only authorizes the activities listed in the decision (i.e. cultivation of authorized organisms, using authorized gear).
- You are responsible for obtaining other applicable licenses that authorize the sale of organisms from your site.
- You are responsible for complying with reporting requirements and other regulations governing the use of your site and any product harvested from your LPAs.


Aquaculture Harvester License (AHL)

- ▶ The Aquaculture Harvester License (AHL) allows the holder to sell product from their site.
- ▶ If you hold an LPA site(s) and you sell product from that site, you need to have an AHL. Any individual listed as a helper on your LPA does not need to obtain their own AHL to harvest and sell product from your site. *However, helpers who have their own LPA sites need to have their own AHL.*
- ▶ LPAs held for personal use are exempt from having to obtain an AHL, because they can't sell product.

Changes to Aquaculture Reporting

- ▶ Effective January 1, 2021, AHL holders need to report harvesting activity on their aquaculture sites, to DMR's Landings Program, on a monthly basis.
- ▶ All data needs to be submitted to the Landings Program by the 10th day of the following month. For example, reports for the month of April must be received by DMR on or before May 10th.

Changes to Reporting and Confidentiality

- ▶ These changes are intended to improve and streamline the reporting process, so that the State of Maine can better represent and demonstrate the value of the aquaculture sector.
 - ▶ Information collected as part of reporting is kept confidential as required by statute and regulation. DMR cannot disclose to the public any statistics unless they are in aggregate or summary form, which protects the identity of the business, or individual.
 - ▶ The disclosure of price and landings data for individual growers is prohibited by law.
