Shellfish Harvesting Area Classification-Notification of Changes

September 19, 2019

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Under the authority of 12 M.R.S.A. § 6172; the Commissioner has made the following classification change to Area No. 26-B, Martin Point, Friendship to Gay Island, Cushing: This notice reclassifies a portion of Friendship Long Island from Approved to Prohibited due to a point pollution source identified during shoreline survey. All existing pollution and biotoxin closures remain in effect.

The boundary descriptions of the area are as follows (struck text is being removed and underlined text is being added):

A. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels from the shores, flats and waters of the following Prohibited area(s):

1. Friendship Harbor, Hatchet Cove and Martin Point (Friendship): east of a line running south from the center of the marine railway on the southwestern side of Martin Point to the northern tip of Gull Rock; AND north of a line running northeast from the northern tip of Gull Rock to the point of land at the end of Bradford Point Road; AND south of a line running southeast from the tip of Jesse's Point to a red painted post on the prominent point on the opposite shore; AND south of a line running south from a red painted post located on the shore of the prominent point of land on the western shore of Hatchet Cove to the northern tip of Little Sand Island, then continuing southeast to the southern tip of Sand Island and continuing along the southern shore of Sand Island, then continuing northeast from the southeastern tip of Sand Island to a red painted post located on the shore of a small unnamed point of land, west of Cove Way Lane.
2. Friendship Long Island (Friendship): South of a line beginning at a red painted post located on the shore of the western most point of the small unnamed island west of Little Morse Island running northwest to a red painted post located on Friendship Long Island approximately 400 yards southwest of the eastern most point on Friendship Long Island; AND north of a line beginning at a red painted post located on the shore of the western most point of the small unnamed island west of Little Morse Island, running southwest to a red painted post located on the southernmost tip of an unnamed point on the Friendship Long Island shore.
3. Cranberry Island (Friendship): South of a line beginning at the most northwestern point on Cranberry Island, running southeast to the most northeastern point on Cranberry Island.
4. Friendship Long Island (Friendship): East of a line beginning on the northwest shore of a lobster pound running south to the opposite shore on Friendship Long Island.
5. Crotch Island (Cushing): Northeast of a line beginning at the most southwestern point of land on Crotch Island running southeast to the southwestern most point of land on Davis Point; AND west

of a line beginning at the most southwest point of land on David Point running northwest to the southeastern point on Crotch Island.


6. Autios Cove Back River (Friendship): North of a line beginning at a red painted post located on the shore approximately 160 yards southwest of the end of Pine Cove Lane running northwest to a red painted post on the opposite shore.
7. Friendship Long Island (Friendship): East of a line beginning at the northwest tip of Ned's Point running northeast to the western tip of a prominent peninsula approximately halfway up the western shore prior to the large unnamed cove.

B. Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters or mussels from the shores, flats and waters of the following Restricted area(s) without a special MDMR permit:

1. Meduncook River (Friendship and Cushing): north of Salt Pond Rd.
2. Friendship Harbor (Friendship): East of a line beginning on the northern tip of Garrison Island running northeast to the point of land at the end of Bradford Point Road; AND northwest of a line beginning at a red painted post on the eastern point of Garrison Island running northeast to a red painted post near the pier at the end of Seaside Farm Drive.
