**Shellfish Harvesting Area Classification-Notification of Changes**

August 31, 2022

Under the authority of 12 M.R.S.A. § 6172; the Commissioner has made the following change to Area No. 164-B: This notice reduces the Quahog Exception Area to the area from Pond Point (Beals) to Great Head (Cutler) due to the absence of harvest activity in the western portion of the fishing grounds. All existing pollution and biotoxin closures remain in effect.

The boundary descriptions of the area are as follows (struck text is being removed and underlined text is being added):

Effective immediately, because of the increased risk of contamination from naturally occurring marine biotoxin (ASP), it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any mahogany/ocean quahogs (*Arctica islandica*) from Maine coastal waters and those offshore waters of the exclusive economic zone (EEZ/200 mile limit) east of a line beginning at Schoodic Point (Winter Harbor) true south to the limits of US jurisdiction; AND west of the US/Canadian border.

EXCEPTION : Ocean quahogs may be harvested east of Jonesport/Beals bridge; AND east of a line beginning at the southwest tip of Pond Point (Beals) Cape Split (Addison) ~~running south to the west tip of Big Nash Island (Addison)~~ then running true south to the limits of US jurisdiction; AND west of a line beginning beginning at the east tip of Great Head (Cutler) then running true south to the limits of US jurisdiction.

Mahogany/ocean quahogs may not be harvested from one half hour after sunset to one half hour before sunrise.
