## Shellfish Harvesting Area Classification – Notification of Changes

February 28, 2025

**This notice is in effect until repealed or replaced.**

Under the authority of 12 M.R.S.A. § 6172; the Commissioner has made the following change to Growing Area EN, Cape Split (Addison) to Kelley Point (Jonesport). This notice changes Grass Cove (Beals) from Prohibited to Approved due to remediation of a potential pollution point source. All existing pollution and biotoxin closures remain in effect.

The boundary descriptions of the area are as follows (struck text is being removed and underlined text is being added):

Prohibited: Effective immediately, because of pollution, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops taken from the shores, flats and waters of the following Prohibited areas:

- P1. Indian River (Addison, Jonesport): north of a line beginning at the south tip of Sugar Point (Addison) running east across the river to the western tip of Noyes Point (Jonesport)
- P2. Moosabec Reach (Jonesport): north of a line beginning at the west end of Henry Point, running southwest to Coast Guard Daymark 18; then running southwest to Coast Guard Nun 18A; then running southwest to the eastern tip of Barneys Island (Beals); AND northeast of a line beginning at the eastern tip of Barneys Island then running northwest to Saddlers Point (Jonesport).
- P3. North End of Beals Island (Beals): east of a line beginning at the western tip of Indian Point running north to the eastern tip of Barneys Island; AND south of a line beginning at the eastern tip of Barneys Island running northeast to Coast Guard Nun 18A; AND west of a line beginning at Coast Guard Nun 18A running south to the eastern tip of Perio Point.
- P4. Alley Bay-Pig Island Gut (Beals): south of a line beginning at Hixey Head running northeast to the southernmost point on Sawyer Island, then running southeast to the most northeast tip of Great Wass Island.
- ~~P5. East of the road at the mouth of the Grass Cove (Beals) impoundment.~~


Conditionally Approved (Rainfall, Seasonal): Effective immediately, because of intermittent pollution due to rainfall, it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops (from aquaculture leases with an MOU only) from the shores, flats and waters of the following Conditionally Approved area(s) when rainfall meets or exceeds 1" within a 24-hour period from November 1<sup>st</sup> through June 30<sup>th</sup>. Also because of seasonal pollution this area will be closed from July 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>). - CA1. Indian River (Addison): north of a line beginning at the end of Rockwell Road NW running west to a red painted post on Crowley Island located approximately 850 yards southeast from the south end of the Crowley Island Bridge; AND north of a line beginning at the prominent point at the end of West River Road (Addison) running east to the northwest tip of Crowley Island (Addison); AND south of a line beginning at the south tip of Sugar Point (Addison) running east to the western tip of Noyes Point (Jonesport) (closed July 1<sup>st</sup> through October 31<sup>st</sup>).

Approved: All other shores, flats and waters not described in the above sections are Approved and it is lawful to dig, take or possess any clams, quahogs, oysters, mussels or whole or roe-on scallops (from aquaculture leases with an MOU only) when in the open status.
