CHAPTER 94 - SANITARY CONTROL OF MOLLUSCAN SHELLFISH

94.02 Definitions

In addition to definitions contained in the "Definitions" section of the Model Ordinance, the following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meaning.

- A. Buying station. A truck that is leased, owned or rented by the certified dealer and which is used to transport shellstock purchased at a location other than the dealer's permanent facility. The truck must be properly constructed, operated and maintained to prevent contamination, deterioration and decomposition of the shellstock in accordance with the Model Ordinance.
- B. Model Ordinance. The document entitled "National Shellfish Sanitation Program Guide for the Control of Molluscan Shellfish", 2015-2017 Revision, Sections I and II, published by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

Basis Statement:

This rule amends Chapter 94 to specify the current version of the National Shellfish Sanitation Program Model Ordinance (Model Ordinance). The previous version of the rule specified the 2015 Model Ordinance, whereas this rule specifies the 2017 Model Ordinance, which is the most current version.
