Historical Appearance

- First Published Reports South of Cape Cod in 1880's
- Numerous Reports and Observations North of Cape Cod early 1900's
- Maine Marine Wardens reports:
 - Many in Phippsburg in 1906-1907
 - Present in Boothbay Harbor in 1909
 - Few observed in St George River in 1907
- Earliest Report in Eastern Maine
 - Warden Woodward observed great numbers on flats on Spruce Island – 4 miles east of Jonesport in 1919
- First complaints as enemy to Soft-shell clams in western part of state in 1914-1916

Trapping


- 1930 Essex Mass
 - Two lobsterman paid \$.50/bushel
 - 3 hours 7 traps 50 bushels
- Loves Cove, Southport
 - 1949 Traps baited with 6 clams
 - Fall inter-tidal caught more females
 - Winter deep water large males
 - Populations migrate to traps

Fencing

Plum Island Sound Newburyport, Mass 1953




Experimental clam farm protected from crab predators by 300 foot circular fence, Plum Island Sound near Newburyport, Massachusetts, June 1953.
