AQUACULTURE LEASE RENEWAL APPLICATION

3. Describe the type and amount of aquaculture to be conducted during the new term:

Overview: The new term will continue to focus on both scientific research and educational outreach, with a focus on studying our permitted marine species, aquaculture techniques, and environmental stewardship. We will maintain the cultivation of sugar kelp, winged kelp, sea scallops, blue sea mussels, and Eastern/American oysters in line with established best practices, leveraging the long-term monitoring and research capabilities of our farm. In the new term, PEN Hlx will remain dedicated to studying key environmental and aquaculture-related questions and offering real-world applications and learning opportunities for students, researchers, and the surrounding communities. Additionally, we are seeking approval for non-commercial human consumption that furthers scientific research and increases educational engagement that 'advances [the] field or...impact[s]... the progress in that field' as defined in Chapter 2.05(H).

Scallops: Scallop aquaculture will continue in the new term. Animals will be grown in cages and nets on a long line system. Seed will come from spat bags that are deployed in the Fall and retrieved in the Spring according to spat license collection regulations. Scallops will continue to be hand-harvested.

Kelp: The seeding, cultivation, and harvesting that happened during the previous lease term will continue. All kelp lines will continue to be deployed in September or October and harvested in the late Spring. All kelp and associated gear will be out of the water by

the end of June. Seed will come from wild kelp or pre-seeded spools from approved sources.

Oysters: Oysters will continue to be grown in floating bags and overwintered on longlines or in bottom cages. Seed will be acquired annually or biannually through approved sources and likely received between June–August with harvesting occurring on an as-needed basis.

Mussels: Mussels will be grown on ropes hung off the underside of the float or where naturally set. Seed will be collected from wild populations on fuzzy ropes during the spring-summer spawning season or via natural settlement on vertical lines or the work float within the farm. If poor settlement occurs, we will consider acquiring seed from a hatchery. All mussels will be hand-harvested.

4. Describe the amount of aquaculture conducted on the lease site during the previous lease term, including but not limited to seeding, cultivation or harvest of organisms:

Overview: The previous lease term involved extensive aquaculture activities aimed at advancing both scientific research, sustainable practices and providing educational opportunities. PEN Hlx cultivated and studied scallops, kelp, oysters, and mussels.

Scallops: Spat bags were deployed annually in September around Hurricane Island and the Muscle Ridge closure area and retrieved in April/May and sorted over the course of the summer with students and staff. Approximately 35,000 spat were caught over this lease period and all were retained, though there were naturally high mortality rates in their first year of life.

Scallops were distributed between bottom cages and lantern nets with approximately 6,000-10,000 individuals on the farm at any time. Approximately 2,500 adult individuals were hand-harvested during this lease term. The majority of the scallops were harvested for tissue condition sampling associated with various experiments and for educational purposes. Research projects centering around scallops included biofouling studies and isotope analysis.

Kelp: Kelp was grown on our longlines. Within the previous lease term, we have used pre-seeded spools as well as seeded our own lines, sometimes with students. The lines were set and seeded in September–October. Students and staff harvested and sampled the kelp from May–June. There was no kelp line set in the Fall of 2023 due to poor settlement. All kelp were hand-harvested.

Oysters: Oysters were grown in floating bags and cages. We received seed from Muscongus Bay Aquaculture. Oysters were hand-harvested on an as needed basis. Research projects included trialing plastic alternatives to traditional gear.

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Mussels: Within the previous term, wild mussels settled naturally on vertical lines and the work float within the aquaculture site. No seed was acquired from a hatchery. All mussels were hand-harvested and used for educational purposes or collected as samples upon the request of the Department of Marine Resources.




