A. Please describe your current operations (seeding, harvesting, tending, maintenance, etc.) within the boundaries of the existing lease area.

Currently we are growing oysters both inside and outside our pounds. While its been a mix of seed to market, we haven't had it organized in a particular matter. We grow seed in our upwelling system (LBA) after which we grow out our product both in gear and on the bottom both inside and outside the pounds. Maintenance follows traditional practices, flipping up every two weeks or so to dry out and harvesting as they come up to size. We tumble and thin using a grader on one of our piers.

B. Please describe how the proposed expansion would affect your current operations (seeding, harvesting, tending, maintenance, etc.).

Expansion would allow us to move some of our cages, from inside our pounds into the outer water where the water is about 2°C colder, and have a depth profile deep enough to sink cages during the winter without air exposure. This would allow us to stagger our oysters so our yearly harvest is spread out throughout the year rather than have all the markets come to size at once.

Oyster Cages are an approved gear type for our current lease.

After this expansion we plan to submit an amendment to our gear types to adjust/ add to what is inside and outside the pounds (in addition to the cages and floating bags we are already approved for). We plan to still have at least one line of oyster cages in the pound. We plan to submit an amendment for our gear once the expansion is approved. The overall goal of the expansion (and follow up amendment) is to turn the north pound into a seed grow-out area that will utilize the warmer water. The proposed gear (cages) with this expansion would be flipped up once every two weeks to remove biofoul. These cages would contain oysters at least a year old up to market size. Once oysters come to market size, the oysters in the cages will be submerged for the appropriate deportation time before harvest.

Empty cages would be flipped up to dry until they are refilled with more oysters.

C. Please describe how the proposed expansion aligns with your operational plans for the duration of the remaining lease term.

The expansion will allow our farm to become a successful commercial operation. It will allow us to be able to grow and sell more oysters. It'll offset our selling so we can sell year round as stated above. We plan to make full use of our standard lease throughout the rest of its term, after which we will renew. We experimented with the business model a bit and now we know where we want to take it as a company.

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D. Suspended culture gear can attract birds that roost on the gear and defecate, potentially creating a pollution source impacting shellfish held within the gear. In order to comply with the National Shellfish Sanitation Program (NSSP) Model Ordinance (MO), and if your expansion would include the suspended culture of shellfish, include a description of mitigation or deterrent measures to minimize the potential pollution impacts of birds at the proposed site. - Submerging suspended gear and associated product at a depth sufficient to deter roosting for two weeks before harvest
- Attaching physical deterrents (i.e. zip ties) to gear

- The site is proposed for the culture of adductor-only scallops (i.e. no other shellfish species would be grown on the site)
- Proposed gear would always be suspended below the surface of the water at a depth sufficient to deter roosting (i.e. as is common for scallop lantern nets)

To deter birds we will attach zip ties to any cages we would be harvesting from along their pontoons. These zip ties would act as "ticklers" to prevent the birds from comfortably roosting on the gear. 10. NOISE AND LIGHT

Noise emitted would be admitted only by the outboard of our 19ft Carolina work skiff. The skiff is used daily to travel around the lease tending to the farm. The lease doesn't currently involve light at any level. Our piers are not lit up at night and we don't work after dark for safety reasons.

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11. ENVIRONMENTAL CHARACTERIZATION

A. What are the approximate depths at mean low water within the proposed expansion?

Mean low water starting on the side closest to the south pound wall is roughly 2 feet. The mean low water increases to 8 feet on the far end of the proposed expansion of the lease. Observed 3/3/2025 from a skiff with a marked rope

B. What are the approximate depths at mean high water within the proposed expansion?

Mean high water would range from 14 feet to 20 feet from the South pound wall moving outward to the far end of the proposed lease border.

Observed 3/3/2025 from a skiff with a marked rope

C. What are the bottom characteristics within the proposed expansion (mud, sand, gravel, rock, ledge or some mix, etc.)?

The bottom is entirely made up of mud with some sand and gravel as you move closer to the old mussel bed on the original lease.

Observed 3/5/2025 by scuba diving

D. Describe the bottom topography (flat, steep rough, etc.).

The bottom is relatively flat with a slight increase in depth as you move closer to the center of the channel.

Observed 3/5/2025 by scuba diving

There isn't much at all. The bottom is barren mud with some occasional hermit crabs, green crabs, barnacles (on the occasional rock). Tunicates are found on old discarded ropes. Observed 8/9/24, 3/5/2025 by scuba diving



Currently none, it's too shallow and muddy for lobster traps. In the summer, kayakers are seen travelling the far side of the channel. Images in this document show a boat mooring when satellite imaging was taken. This mooring is no longer present.
B. Describe any effects your proposed expansion might have on existing uses of the area.
By placing cages there in close proximity to the southern lobster pound structure, boats would not be able to travel along the lobster pound during a peak high tide. Due to the shallow profile of the area boats currently only travel the existing channel that runs alongside Oar island that has a suitable depth for boat travel most of the tide cycle. Kayakers wouldn't be affected.
