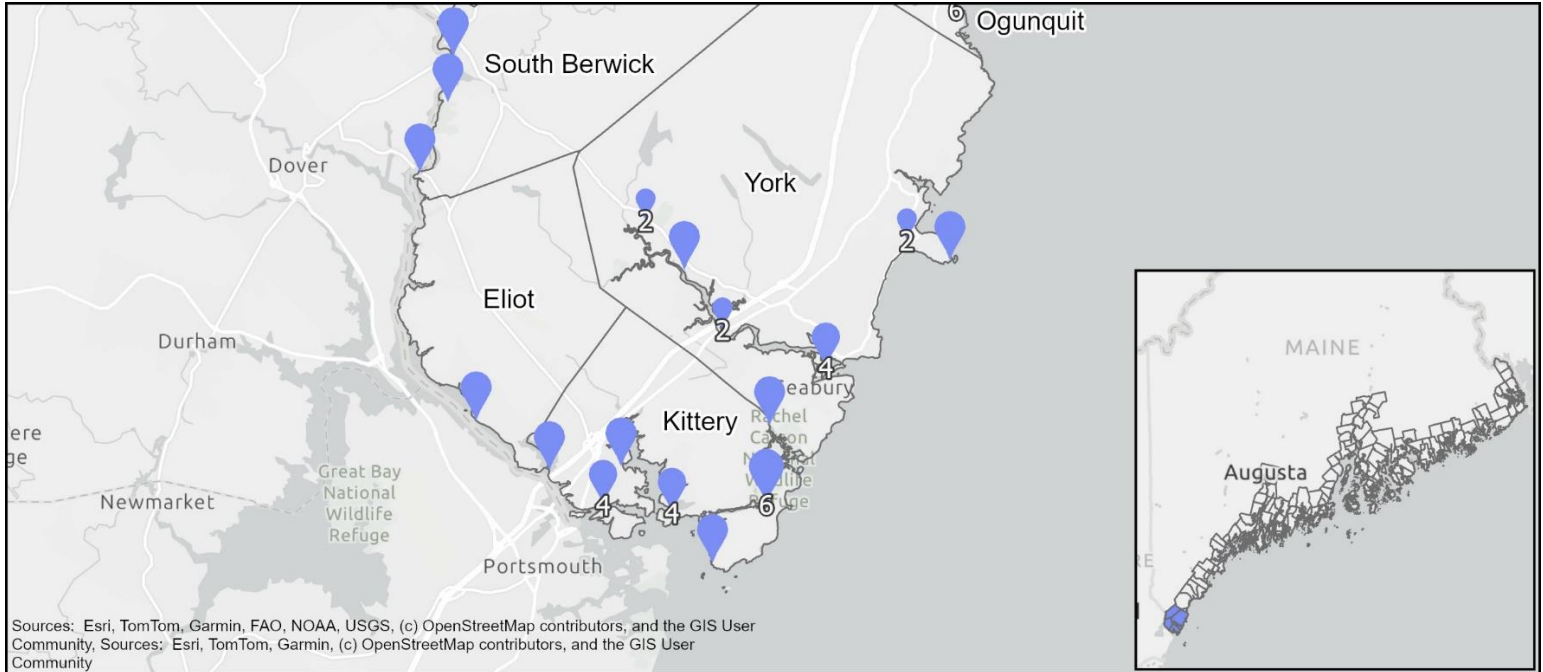

MAINE COASTAL PUBLIC ACCESS GUIDE

Vaughan Woods Memorial State Park, South Berwick

Lat/Long: 43.2120, -70.8124



SITE DESCRIPTION

This 250-acre park features trail loops that can be linked for a three-mile walk through woods that include stands of old-growth pine and hemlock and provide vistas of the Salmon Falls River. The area offers opportunities for birding (best in early morning), viewing plants and mammals, and horseback riding. The trails, on gravel or duff, vary from gentle terrain to steep slopes. Visitors can find a picnic area and seasonal pit toilet on site. Leashed dogs are allowed; an entrance fee is charged. The park has an off-street lot with about two dozen spaces.

William A. Bray Memorial Park, South Berwick

SITE DESCRIPTION

This three-acre town park on the shore of the Salmon Falls River provides nice views of the undeveloped river and a part-tide gravel boat launch. Fishing enthusiasts enjoy dropping a line from the nearby bridge. Dogs are allowed but must be leashed. Parking is limited and only permitted from sunrise to sunset; few trailers can be accommodated.

Barter's Creek Right-of-Way, Kittery

SITE DESCRIPTION

A short trail through the woods leads to a tidal inlet with a rock ledge. Anglers can cast here, paddlers can launch a canoe or kayak from the bank, and people can swim, but all activities are tide dependent. Park off-road (very limited) on the right immediately before the causeway over Barter's Creek. Access is next to the culvert.

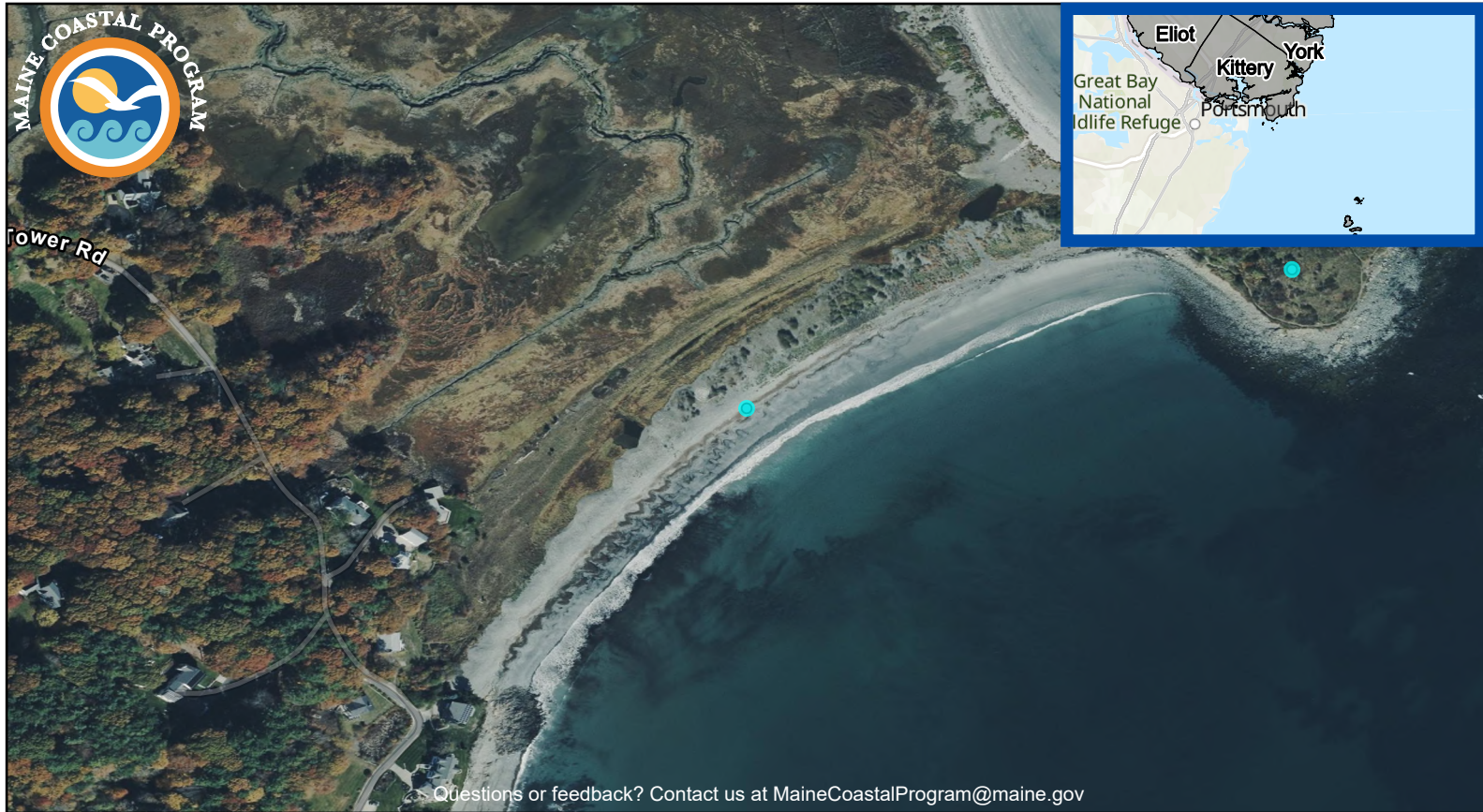

Crescent Beach, Kittery

Lat/Long: 43.0851, -70.6641



SITE DESCRIPTION

Crescent and Seapoint Beaches flank Seapoint on the northeast corner of Gerrish Island facing the open ocean. Crescent is about a third of a mile, with a bed of small rocks and a bit of sand, accessed by way of Seapoint Beach. On a mild day, the waves lap at the shore; when the wind rises, they roll up the beach, leaving wrack and driftwood in straggling lines. A marsh behind the beach, part of the Rachel Carson National Wildlife Refuge, offers good birding. Composting toilets are located at nearby Cutts Island Trail.

SITE DESCRIPTION

From this part-tide boat launch, kayakers and canoeists can head south along Chauncey Creek. The site is located almost opposite the Cutts Island trailhead and a few parking spaces are available at the trailhead. A break in the guard rail allows hand-carry access to a tiny stone ramp.

Cutts Island Trail, Kittery

SITE DESCRIPTION

This 1.8-mile wooded trail provides upland hiking, lovely views of the salt marsh, and birding opportunities in the Rachel Carson National Wildlife Refuge. The trail is open sunrise to sunset to foot traffic only; pets are not allowed. Hunters with a refuge permit can hunt here, so visitors should wear orange in the fall. A vault toilet is located at the trail head which also serves the Cutts Island Lane Right-of-Way carry-in kayak or canoe access site. One can also launch a kayak or canoe from the shore at this site and head north towards Brave Boat Harbor. There is limited on-street parking.

SITE DESCRIPTION

The view from this 94-acre town park at the mouth of the Piscataqua River is stupendous: On a clear day, you can see Whaleback Light, Wood Island Lifeboat Station and the Isles of Shoals. The northernmost section of the park has picnic tables and grills and a sandy/pebbly beach. A long pier juts into the water, providing an extensive platform for fishing. To the southeast, a separate area, with a crescent of sand ideal for launching, has been set aside for windsurfers and sea kayakers. Scuba diving is allowed anywhere outside of the main beach area. A trail runs above the high tide line along the park's shore. Concrete bunkers and fortifications, built in the early 1900s, serve as a universal backdrop. Dogs are allowed in most areas but must be leashed. Park users must carry out their trash. Motorized watercraft, ATVs and dirt bikes are not allowed. There is a seasonal entrance fee, and porta potties available by the parking lot.

Fort McClary State Historic Site, Kittery

SITE DESCRIPTION

The white hexagonal fort, earthworks, and jumble of granite blocks offer a view into history. In 1808, when this fort was being built, veterans of the Revolutionary War and their families still bore the losses of the conflict. Major Andrew McClary, a New Hampshire native, had died at Bunker Hill; this fort was named in his honor. From the mowed grounds, visitors can look out onto a flotilla of sailboats in Portsmouth Harbor, with two sentinel structures: Portsmouth Harbor Light, located next to Fort Constitution on New Castle Island to the south, and Whaleback Light, to the southwest. Across the street from the fort, there's a picnic area, shelter, playground, and restrooms. Dogs must be leashed.

SITE DESCRIPTION

This wooded trail leads to a salt marsh and, at low tide, mudflats of the west shore of Spruce Creek. Visitors should use caution and be aware of storm damage while hiking. Birders enjoy the variety in habitat, with the opportunity to see both land birds and waterbirds on this 27-acre parcel. Well-behaved dogs are welcome, and ambitious kayakers can find suitable banks to hand-carry along the trail at high tide. Parking is at the trailhead.

SITE DESCRIPTION

The Kittery Land Trust owns this rocky two-acre finger of land that anchors beaches to the north and south. From here, on a clear day, visitors can view Nubble Light, Isles of Shoals and Cape Ann. Given the restrictions on nearby parking, Seapoint (as well as Crescent and Seapoint Beaches) are perfect destinations for bicyclists. Site rules are the same as Seapoint and Crescent Beaches. Access is from Seapoint Beach.

SITE DESCRIPTION

This beach is a quarter-mile crescent of fine sand backed by cobbles and marsh. It's a lovely place to swim, sunbathe, and take in the long view of the rolling Atlantic. There are no bathrooms here, but the nearby Cutts Island Trail has a composting toilet at the trailhead. In summer, dogs are not allowed during the day; the beach and parking area are closed at night. Parking is designated for Kittery residents and general visitors along the street.

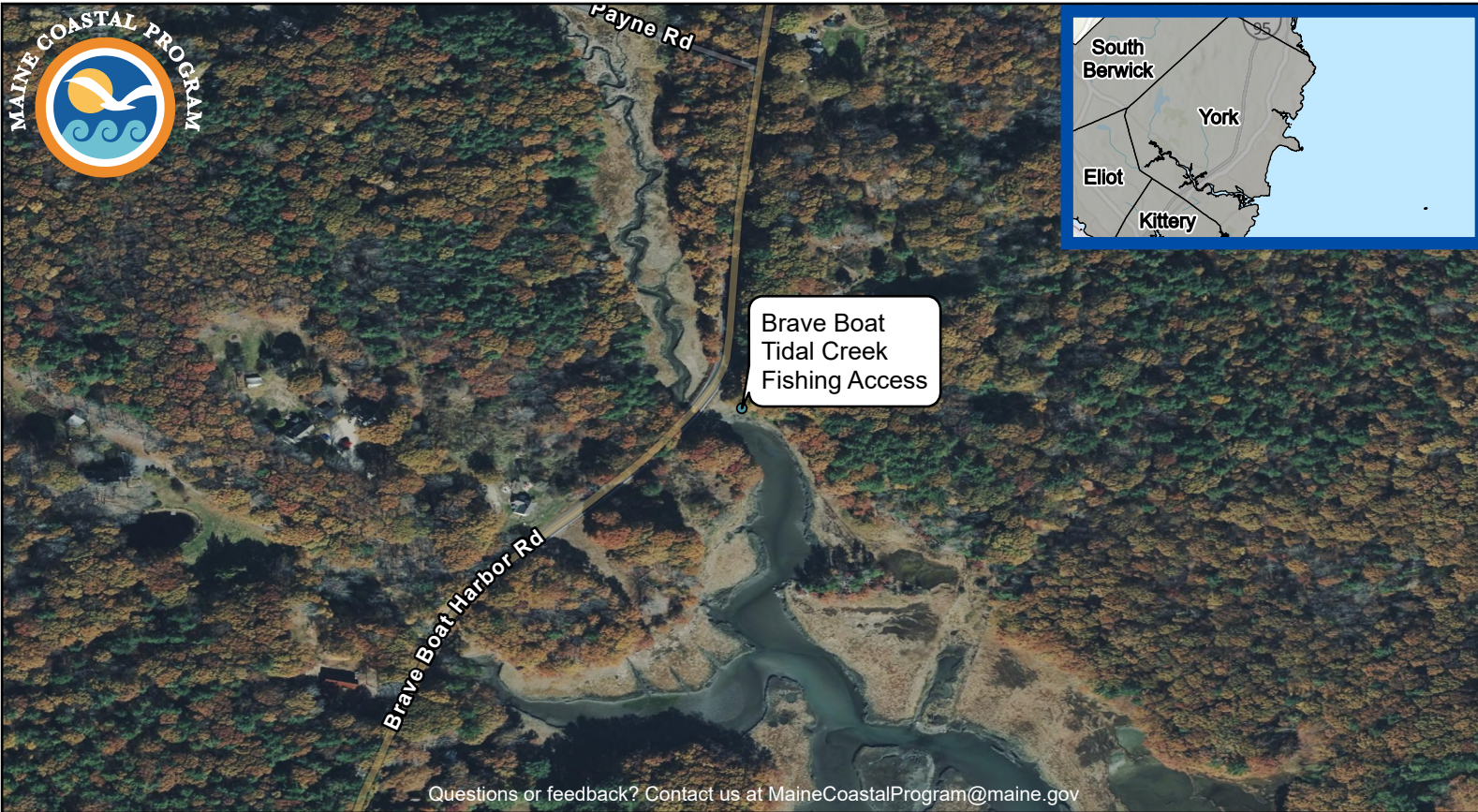

SITE DESCRIPTION

This serene, undeveloped stretch of tidal creek offers anglers a chance to cast a line and capture some respite from a busy life. People may fish from dawn to dusk on the north bank, from the bridge to the first trestle downstream – about a 1,000 foot shoreline overall. Because this land is part of the Rachel Carson National Wildlife Refuge, both refuge regulations as well as Maine fishing regulations apply. Park on the main road next to the creek between Payne and bridge (space is limited), as there is no parking at the refuge.

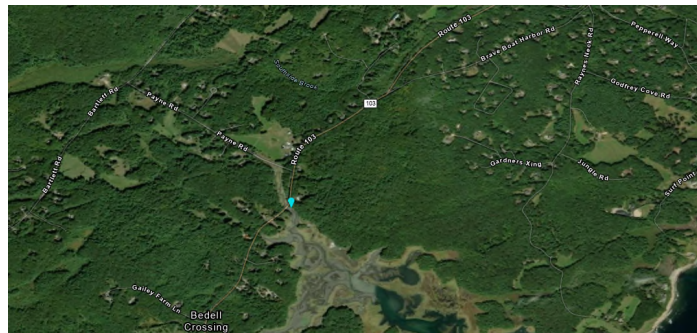

Harbor Beach, York

SITE DESCRIPTION

At low tide, beach lovers can settle into a wide area of fine sand; when the tide comes in, there's still room to spread out a towel on this quarter-mile-long beach. Western Point and Black Rocks (shoals to the east) offer protection from the large swells of the open ocean, making this an appealing place to dabble in the water. A lifeguard is on duty during the summer. In addition to offering its own beauty, the beach anchors two scenic walks: Cliff Path follows the northern shore for half a mile, and Fisherman's Walk runs southwest along the north shore of the York River to ME 103. Hartley Mason Park, on the southwest corner of the beach, offers scenic views and an interpretive sign. The parking lot is reserved for town residents, but visitors can find time-limited parking along Route 1A.

SITE DESCRIPTION

A lightkeeper's house and a white tower with a black turret stand at the crest of this tiny island just offshore of Cape Neddick. Visitors can take in this classic view of Cape Neddick Light Station from Sohier Park, three acres on the tip of The Nubble, as the peninsula is also called. The bedrock here is gabbro, a dark igneous rock that resists weathering and thus provides endless opportunity for scrambling along the shore. Scuba divers (allowed all days except Sunday) find the area's fish, plant life and steep underwater walls inviting despite slippery entry/exit rocks at low tide. In winter, birders expect the usual ducks and waterbirds but also scout for unusual species that occasionally fly into view; in the fall, this is a good spot for migrating warblers and sparrows. Other outdoor enthusiasts get out their poles for shore fishing. A seasonal welcome center with gift shop and restrooms are located on-site. Dogs are welcome. Parking is free but limited to 2 hours; the two lots fill quickly.

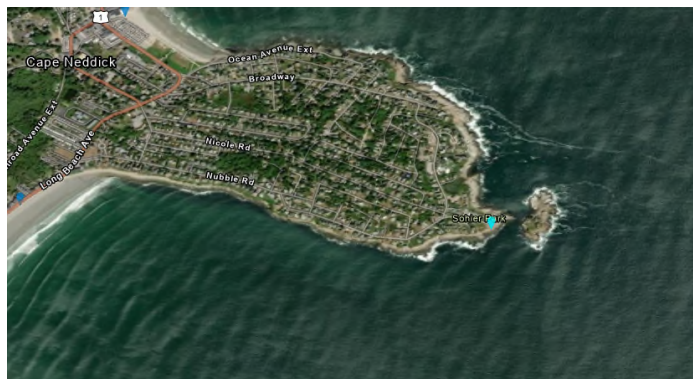
