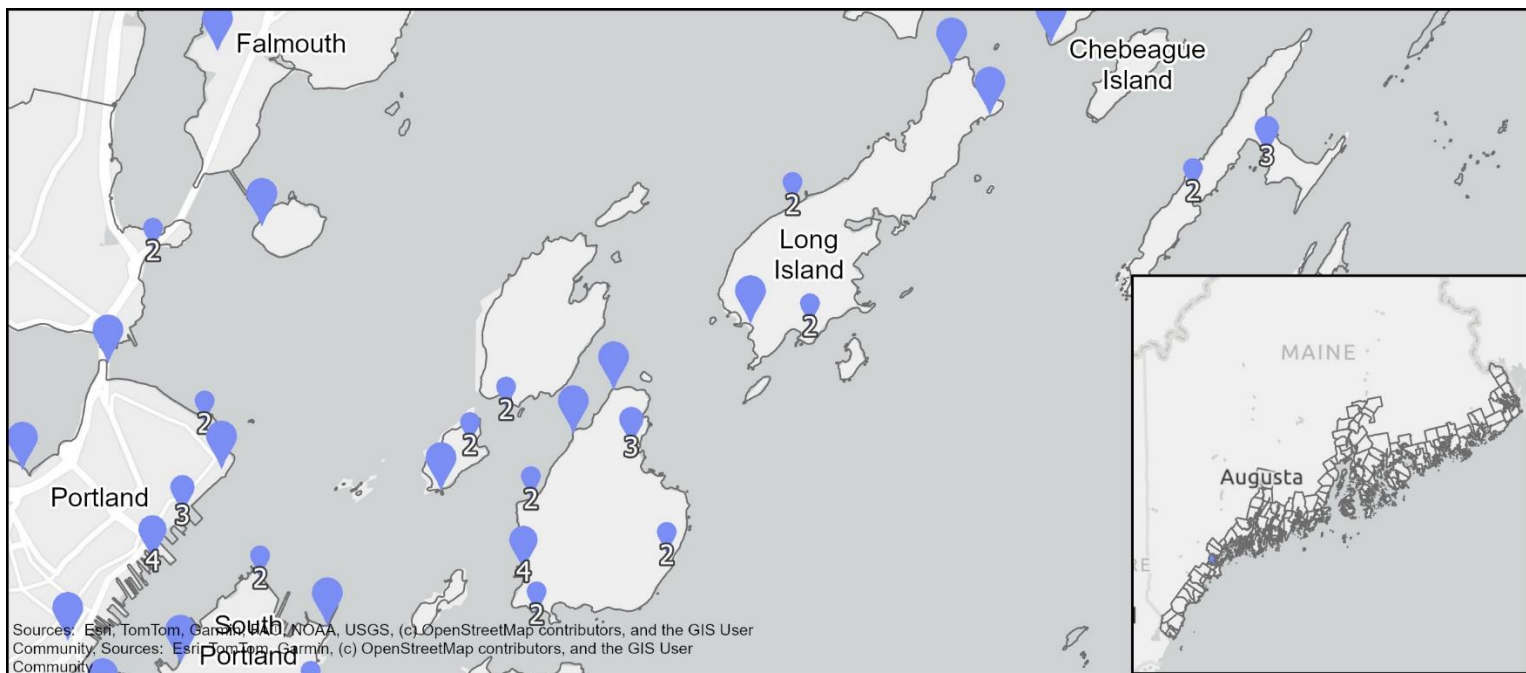

## Back Shore, Portland Islands

Lat/Long: 43.6564, -70.1789



### SITE DESCRIPTION

This 1.5-mile scenic section of the eastern shore is located along the island's loop road and Seashore Ave. Many people walk or bike the route, stopping to relax, eat and read on easily accessible rocks and ledges. The rocky beaches are lovely for picnicking and sight-seeing, with dramatic open ocean views of islands and sailboats. Tide pools form at low water, offering opportunities for exploration. The rocky shore and ocean swells make the area inappropriate for swimming. The City of Portland owns this popular destination.

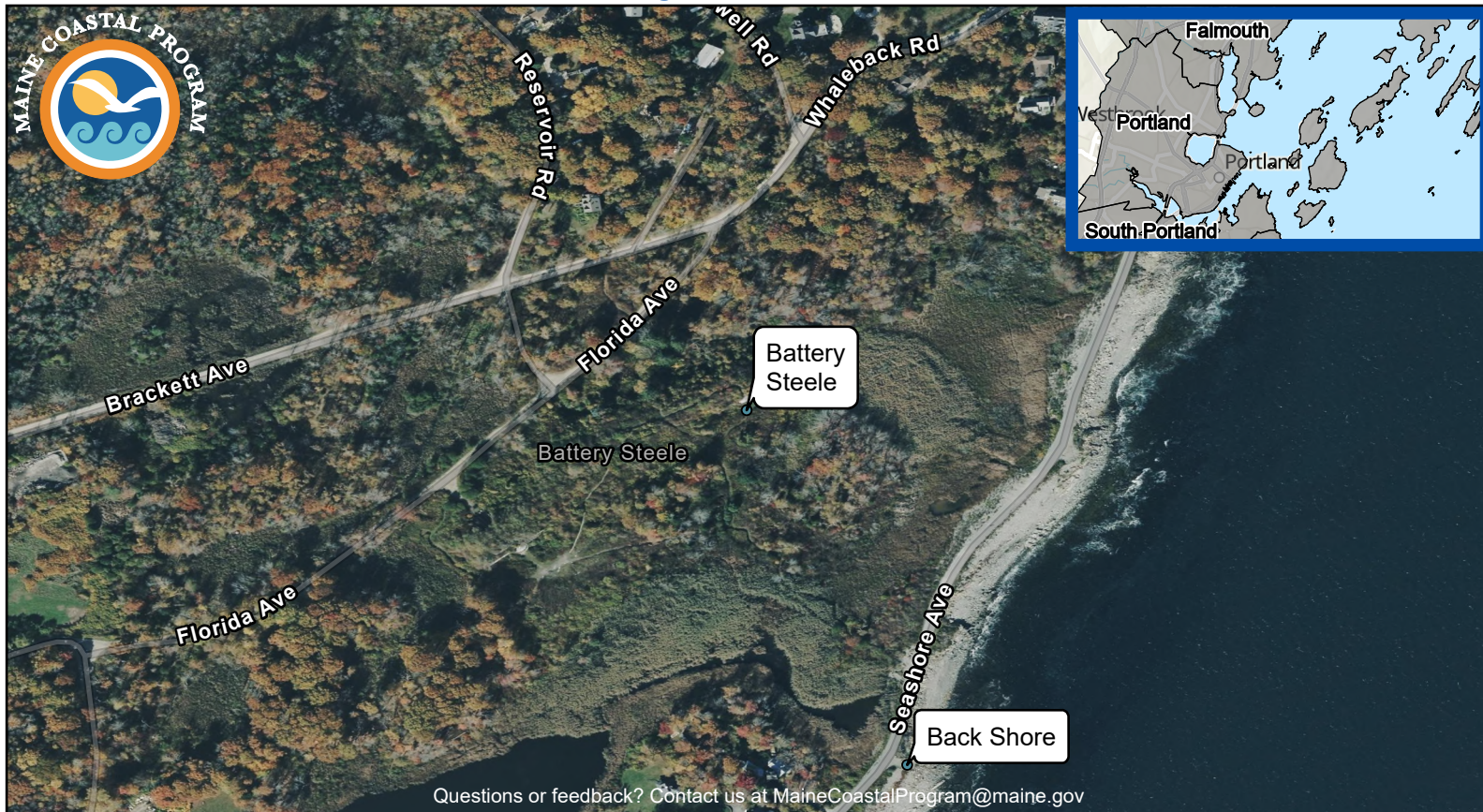

## Battery Steele, Portland Islands

Lat/Long: 43.6587, -70.1798



### SITE DESCRIPTION

During World War II this battery, at the mouth of Portland Harbor, was the most important fortification in Casco Bay. Each of its two 16" guns – triangulated by observation towers on Peaks, Jewell, Cushing and Bailey Islands – could shoot a 2,240-pound shell nearly 26 miles at enemy battleships or submarines. Years later, when the site was threatened by development, island activists formed the Peaks Island Land Preserve to purchase the property and conserve it as open space. Although the battery provides no direct access to the water, this reminder of the past does provide sweeping ocean view. Visitors are encouraged to go by foot or bicycle; a path from Seashore Ave passes through a marsh and along a pond. The battery can also be reached from Brackett Ave, a dirt road, where on-street parking may be available.

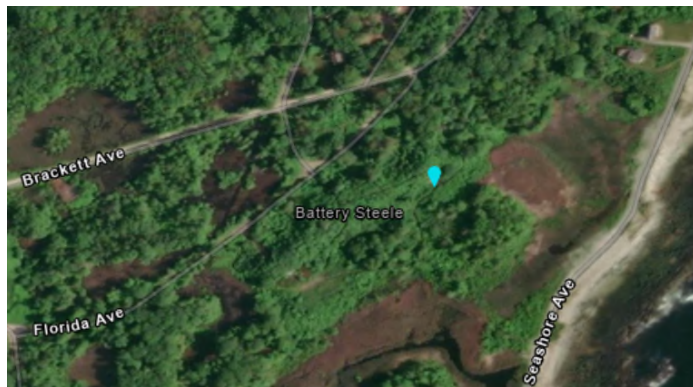

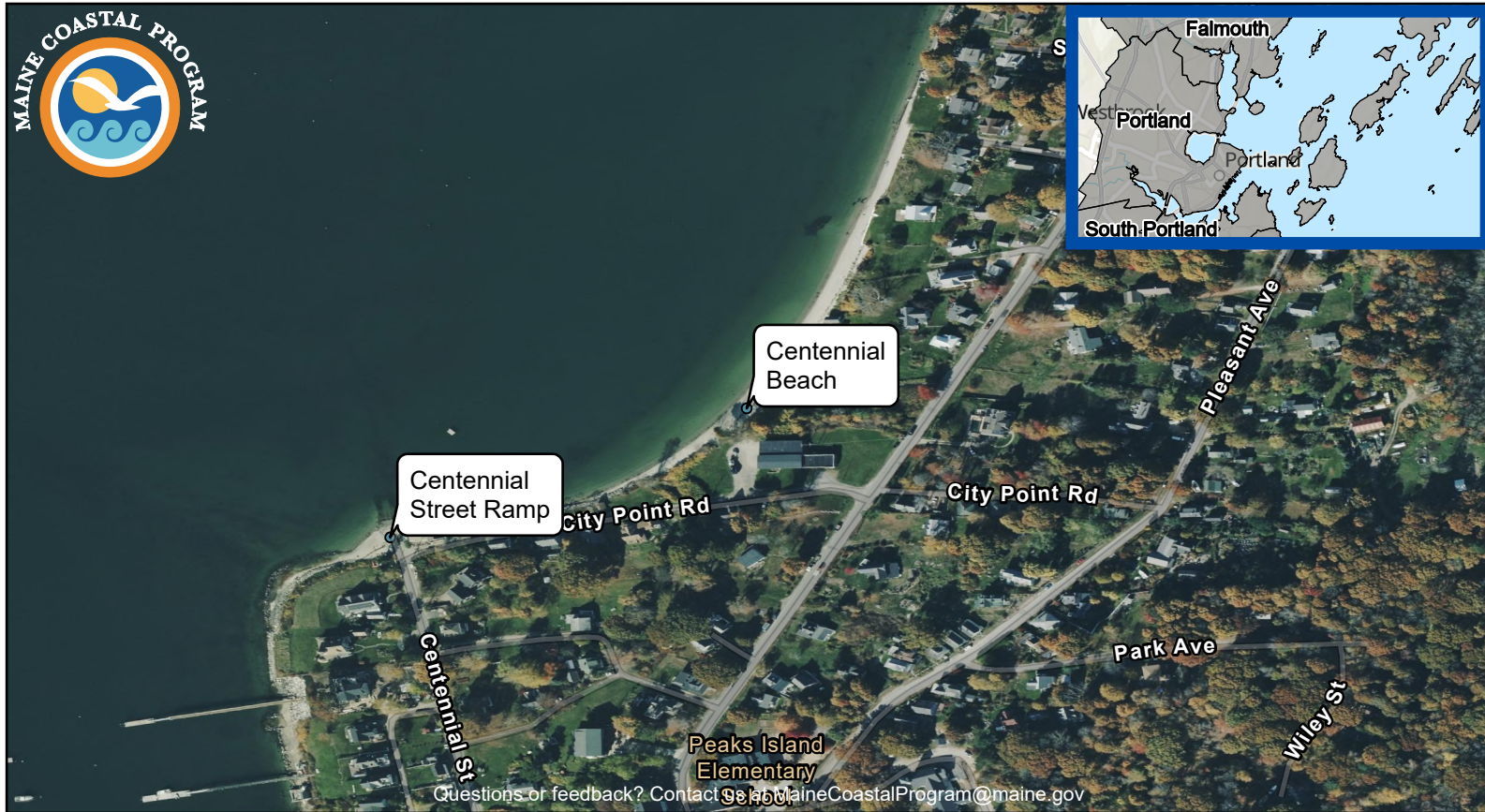

## Centennial Beach, Portland Islands

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This white sand beach, better at lower tide when more beach is exposed, is lovely for swimming; its shallow, sandy areas are ideal for wading and young children's water play. Beach goers can enjoy views of nearby islands, diving seabirds and sailboat races. There is limited on-street parking. Take a short path to the beach.

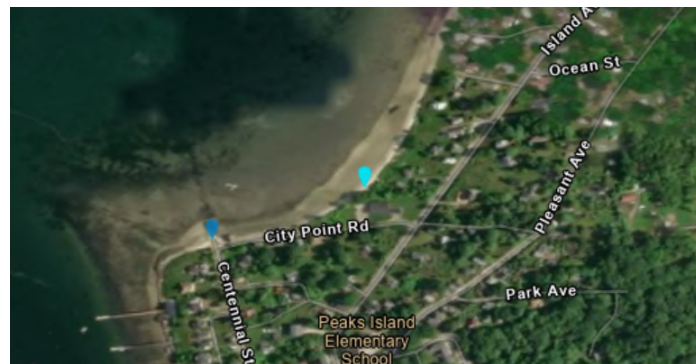

## Centennial Street Ramp, Portland Islands

Lat/Long: 43.6625, -70.1991



### SITE DESCRIPTION

This wide, concrete, half-tide boat ramp can accommodate any size trailer. Paddlers can launch from the ramp or from granite blocks on either side, and small, sandy patches of beach provide sites for swimming and wading. The ramp looks across to the Diamond Islands. The ramp, located at the corner formed by Centennial Street and City Point Road, has limited parking on the shoulder.

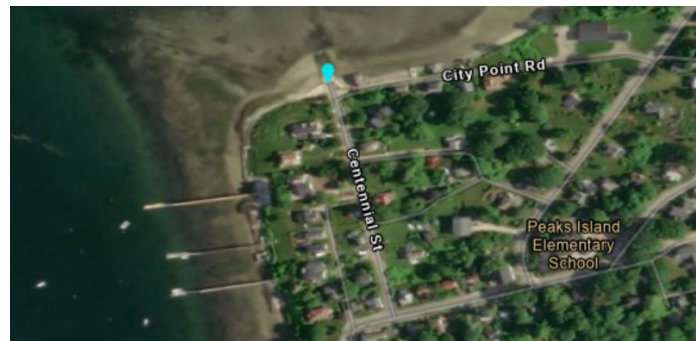

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This site, owned by the Cliff Island Corporation for Athletics, Conservation and Education (ACE) hosts a large field and is used for community events. It is also home to a freshwater marsh that is good for bird watching, and the field can be used to access a nearby beach. It is possible to hand-launch a kayak or similar vessel here but be prepared to walk it across the field first. A small playground can be found on the south side of the field.

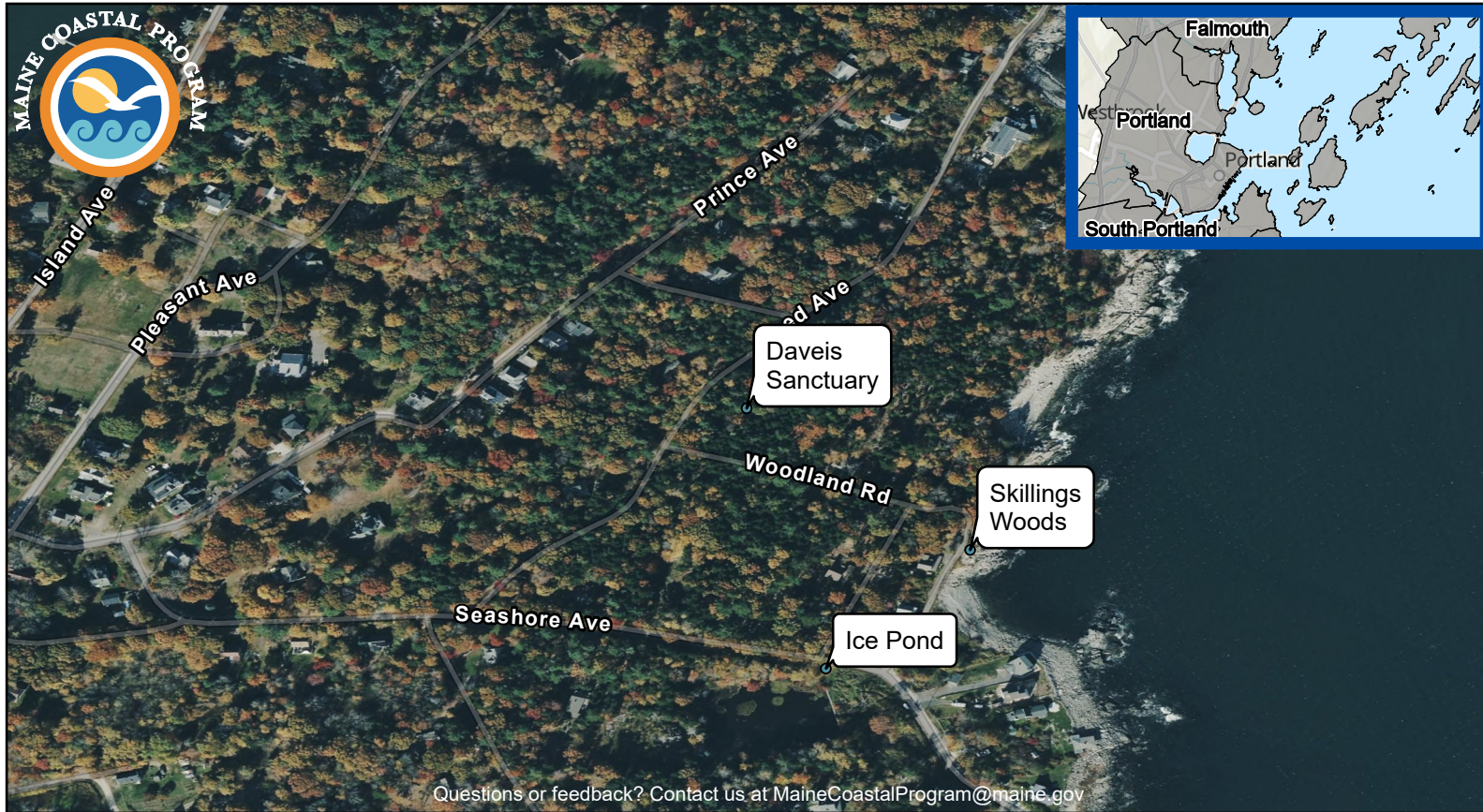

This site provides a short walk through the forest on Peaks Island and leads to a rocky shore with views of Long Island and the outermost parts of Casco Bay.

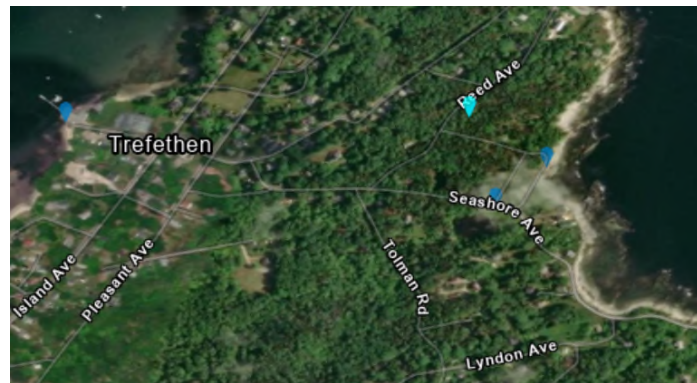

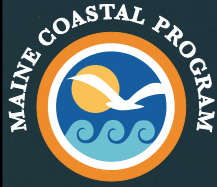

### SITE DESCRIPTION

Visitors can reach this small but popular sand beach from a wooden stairway that leads through a wall of wild roses. This family area has excellent wading and shallow, safe swimming; it's a great place for water toys, kayaks and beach exploration. Adventurers can easily wade across a sandbar to offshore rocks at low tide. There is limited on-street parking.

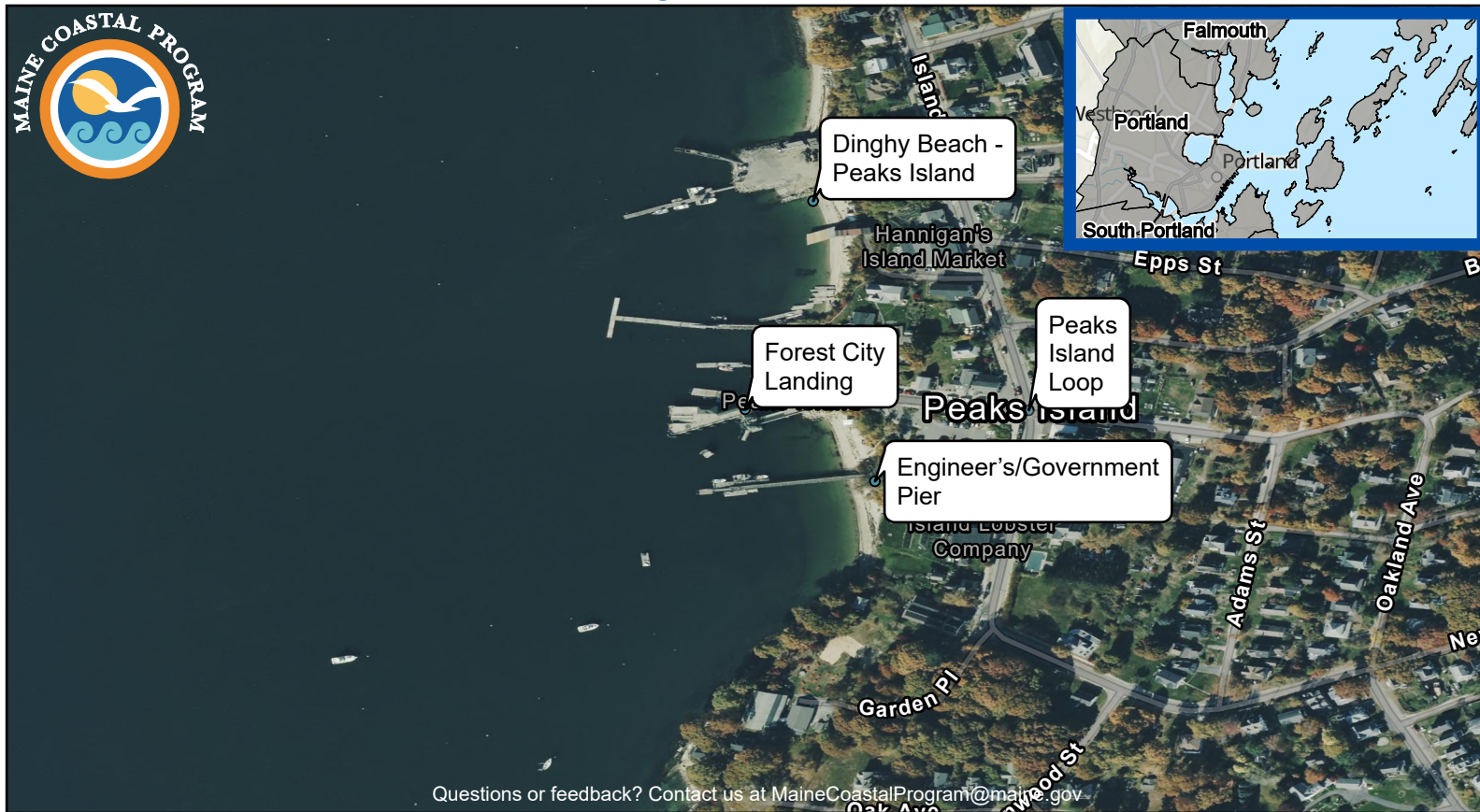

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This large dock where the ferry lands has a wide ramp for loading and unloading vehicles and cargo as well as an attached float that is limited to quick service tie-ups. Commercial fishermen also use this site to load and unload gear, so it has more of a rugged, working Maine atmosphere than the Diamond Cove Ferry Landing. Limited parking is available at the end of peninsula where the dock begins; there is a large lot for golf carts.

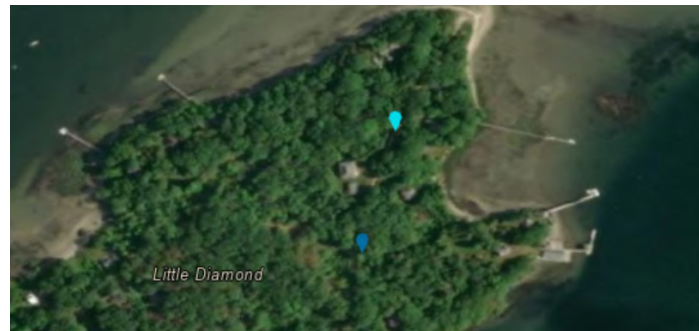

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This Peaks Island parcel was formally protected in 2014 by Peaks Island Land Preserve and the Oceanside Conservation Trust of Casco Bay. It was historically used for ice harvesting and has also served as the community skating pond in winter. A visit in summer won't allow for ice skating, but wildlife viewing and relaxation is still possible. This parcel is also near Skillings Woods and the Daveis Sanctuary.

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This ferry dock has a long pier with a private shelter where passengers may wait out rough weather. The pier offers expansive views of Casco Bay islands, the ferry's transit, and large summer homes thickly screened by shade trees and gardens. A connected floating dock is a public landing that offers dinghy tie-ups and a place for people to hand-carry launch. Swimmers may walk out the long pier to the dock and leap in the bay's icy waters to cool off. The landing is at the south end of the island, at the end of Cityview Road. Although the roads are available to public foot and bike traffic, no larger motor vehicles are allowed on the island and all the properties beyond the roadways are private.

### SITE DESCRIPTION

Peaks offers bicyclists and amblers 4 miles of flat, paved roads that run from the rugged, rockbound waterfront through tranquil, residential neighborhoods. Brisk salt breezes; a rocky shoreline fringed with lupine, beach peas, and wild roses; small coves for swimming and tide pool exploration; benches along the water with views of lobstermen hauling traps and sailboats heeling into the wind – it's all there. Visitors should remember that although island traffic is slow and relatively minimal, the roads are narrow and merit careful navigation.

### SITE DESCRIPTION

This area – also known as Sandy Beach – is tucked behind Vaill Island, which provides protection from waves and onshore breezes. The combination of gentle sand and gentle waves is an unbeatable attraction. In summer, umbrellas, lawn chairs, and sandcastles dot the strand. Paddlers can hand-carry launch from the sand. The beach starts at a jumble of wave-smoothed rocks and ledge near the end of the road and swings northeast between a stand of beach grass and the water. Beachgoers should take care to avoid poison ivy, a shrub with leaves composed of three shiny leaflets (in the fall and winter, there may be clusters of cream-colored berries), which grows with other trail-side shrubs. Part of the beach is private; visitors are asked to respect posted signs. Park along the road. Seasonal restrooms are available on-site.

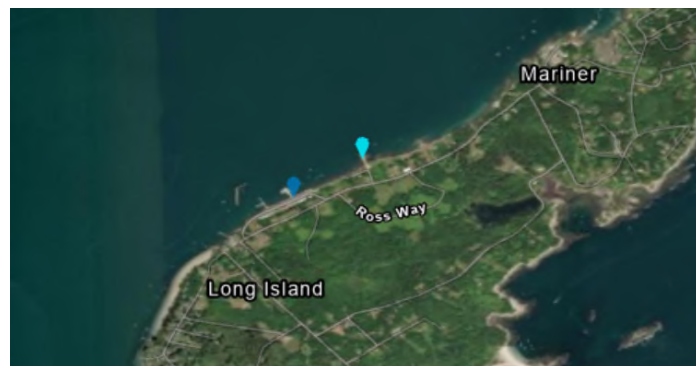
