1. Describe the type and amount of aquaculture to be conducted during the new lease term:

The site will primarily be utilized to cultivate marine algae and green sea urchins using submerged horizontal longline systems. We also anticipate conducting small scale cultivation trials on other species included in our lease agreement utilizing the same types of culture systems, as described in our lease amendment in 2022. The new lease term will conduct aquaculture in the same manner as the old lease term.

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2. Describe the amount of aquaculture conducted on the lease site during the previous lease term, including but not limited to seeding, cultivation or harvest of organisms:

We have utilized the site every year since 2013 to cultivate seaweed crops (marine algae), primarily sugar kelp and winged kelp, as well as experimental crops dulse and nori. Marine algae are annual crops, seeded onto submerged horizontal longlines in the autumnal months (Sept-Nov), cultivated throughout the winter, and harvested in the spring and summer months (Mar-Jul). Yields are variable dependent on seaweed species, from 5-30 wet pounds per foot of cultivation line.

Green Sea Urchins were added to the site in 2022, held in lantern nets and cages suspended from submerged horizontal longlines at 10ft depths. Green Sea Urchins are multi-year crops, requiring about 3-5 years to harvest.

This lease was renewed in 2020 for 5 years. In 2021, Springtide Seaweed, LLC was added as a leaseholder. In 2022, the lease was amended to add additional longlines and submerged lantern nets and cages, as well as new species. Since the most recent lease renewal in 2020, Springtide Seaweed LLC has been commercially cultivating seaweed crops on the lease, and is currently expanding green sea urchin crops into commercial cultivation.

3. Suspended culture gear can attract birds that roost on the gear and defecate, potentially creating a pollution source impacting shellfish held within gear.
