Webmap

- Upon opening the map, you will see a screen with an introduction and some disclaimer language
 - Click on the box and select OK to close the splash screen and access the map
- A small tutorial box will open in the center of the screen.
 - There are three pages with information about the filters, tools, and tabular data available to view.
 - Click the X to exit the tutorial
- When the map is open, there are filters on the left, a table on the bottom (click the up arrow), and tools on the upper right.
- The black search bar on the upper right can be used to enter a location (your current address), site name (Crescent Beach), or general interest (beach), and look for appropriate sites.
- Clicking on a site will bring up a pop-up box with additional site information, pictures, and a link to a pdf with a site description and additional amenity and use information.
 - If you need directions to a site, you will want to take the latitude and longitude from the site information pdf and copy/paste that into Google Maps or your preferred search engine; the coordinates will take you to the site.

Filters

The filter tool allows users to select specific site amenities and activities. Once selected, only sites meeting those criteria will show on the map.

Site Amenities

- <u>Picnic Area:</u> Sites that have dedicated picnic areas.
- Pavilion/Picnic Shelter: Sites with covered pavilions for picnicking or other uses.
- Ferry Terminal: Sites with ferry terminals for public access to islands.
- <u>Beach:</u> Sites with sand, gravel, or cobble beaches.
- Trailer Launch: Sites created for the launching of trailered motorboats.
 - Many hand-carried boats (e.g. kayaks, canoes, or stand-up paddleboards)
 can be launched at these sites, but the primary use is often intended to be
 the launching of motorboats. Please check site rules to ensure your intended
 activity can take place.

- We have indicated whether sites can be used at all tidal heights or only at higher tides (in the pdf and to the best of our ability), but your ability to launch may be dependent on the size of your boat. Please check tide tables and the site description, and plan ahead for your visit.
- Hand Carry Launch: Sites where hand-carried boats (e.g. kayaks, canoes, or standup paddleboards) can be launched.
 - These boats can be launched from a variety of places (docks, beaches, tidal river banks, or dedicated launches). The sites in the guide should be fairly easy to access, but some may require a short walk to get the boat to the water. Know your own abilities and comfort level before using sites.
 - We have indicated whether sites can be used at all tidal heights or only at higher tides (in the pdf and to the best of our ability), but use caution. Many sites drain at low tide and there may be expansive mudflats. Please check tide tables and the site description, and plan ahead for your visit.
- Restrooms: Sites with restrooms available, at least seasonally. These could include portapotties or pit toilets as well as indoor facilities with running water. We have included details to the best of our knowledge.
- <u>Handicap Accessibility:</u> If a site has some level of handicap accessibility, we have indicated that in the filters and site description. This does not mean the entire site or all amenities are accessible, but we have indicated accessibility to the best of our ability. Please see the site descriptions for more information.
- No Fee: If selected, this shows sites that have no fee to use.
- <u>Parking:</u> Selecting this filter will show sites where parking is available, either in a lot or on the shoulder. See the site description for additional details about the amount and type of parking available.

Site Activities

- <u>Swimming (Seasonal Lifeguard):</u> Sites where swimming is allowed and seasonal lifeguards are present.
- <u>Swimming (No Lifeguard):</u> Sites where swimming is allowed but no lifeguards are present.
- Hiking/Walking: Sites where trails are present
- Recreational Fishing: Sites where recreational fishing from the shore, tidal riverbank, or a dedicated pier is allowed.
- <u>Dogs Permitted (Check Seasonality):</u> Sites where dogs are allowed. Please respect local leash laws and note that many beaches and bird sanctuaries have varying

restrictions. Please confirm whether pets are allowed at sites by visiting local websites.
